TRAVEL IN POLAND
 By Lynn Trapp

This past summer I travelled to Poland and the Czech Republic to tour, play organs, see churches and sites. It was also my opportunity to lay the groundwork for a new international choral festival in Krakow, Poland, named *Cracovia Cantat*. The inaugural festival will be held in July, 2005 with performances at Mariacki Church and Wawel Cathedral in Krakow, and tour extensions to eastern and central Europe.

My role as the artistic director of the festival will be to work with the Krakow Music Academy, Peter's Way Tours and GMTravel to offer choral singers, directors and organists a fine cultural experience. The combination of fine acoustics, well-maintained pipe organs, and glorious architecture far exceeded my expectations.

There are three major organ festivals held in Poland, including Oliwa Cathedral in Gdansk. I was fortunate to have the opportunity to attend one of the noonday concerts there. The cathedral was packed with men, women, and children to hear the organ and see the moving wooden cherubs with bells and ornate trumpets on the dramatic organ case as the organ played. The moving figures of the organ case are an interesting feature of many Polish organs.

Poland is perhaps not always at the top of a musicians' list for travel, yet the bundle of books and recordings I carried home combined with the personable experience with clergy, musicians and colleagues have provided a new education into a culture which is rich in music-making, especially organ and church music.

Brandon Beachamp was recently hired as the new Director of the Choir School at the House of Hope Presbyterian Church in Saint Paul. Along with five other professional musicians, he teaches, trains and conducts choristers from age 3 to high school seniors. Founded on the Royal School of Church Music model, the Choir School is in its 22nd year serving both the House of Hope congregation and the surrounding community. In August choristers traveled to Rochester England with the past-director Paul Campbell, where they were the choir-in-residence at the Cathedral for one week.

Brandon previously served as Director of Music and Worship at Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Circle Pines and as Music Intern at Hennepin Avenue United Methodist Church in Minneapolis. Brandon holds a degree in Sacred Music from Westminster Choir College in Princeton, New Jersey.

**NEW SEASONAL MUSIC RECORDING in
DOWNTOWN MINNEAPOLIS**

St. Olaf Catholic Church in downtown Minneapolis announces the release of *BEHOLD THAT STAR! The Music of Advent and Christmas*. The double CD set recorded by the music ministry of St. Olaf Church marks a first in the church's history. One hundred of the church's choral singers, soloists and instrumentalists collaborated to record music of anticipation and resounding joy experienced in the Advent-Christmas worship at St. Olaf Church. Robert Harvey, Director of Contemporary Music and Dr. Lynn Trapp, Director of Worship/Music, Organist at St. Olaf directed the long-awaited project. In addition to its educational programs and social outreach projects, St. Olaf has become widely known for its liturgy and music, including concert series and multicultural worship. Whether for family sing-a-long, lighting the Advent wreath or decorating the Christmas tree, or simply resting from the busyness of the season, this recording is a must for every household who seeks to enjoy the warmth and drama of the season's music.
