kins Chapel, Southern Methodist University. In addition to holding this position, he is also Adjunct Associate Professor of Organ and Sacred Music at SMU where he teaches service playing and improvisation, and was recently appointed Associate University Organist. In September 2003, Naxos will release Volume 13 of The Organ Works of Marcel Dupré, recorded on the restored and enlarged Perkins Chapel organ at SMU.

A native of Dallas, a young George Baker won the American Guild of Organists National Competition in Organ Playing in 1970 and created a sensation in the organ world with his subsequent featured recital for the AGO national convention two years later. He then went to Paris to study organ and improvisation as well as to record. He

returned to America to teach organ, then entered medical school. Almost three decades later he has come full circle, returning to music as a performer, improviser, composer and teacher.

George Baker had received training with some of the finest organ teachers of the twentieth-century. He obtained his Bachelor's degree from Southern Methodist University under Robert Anderson, after which he traveled to Paris to study with Marie-Claire Alain, Pierre Cochereau, Jean Langlais and André Marchal. During his time in France, Baker earned the Prix de Virtuosité with Mention Maximum from the Schola Cantorum, under Langlais. Ultimately, he returned to the United States where he earned a Master of Music degree on full scholarship from the University of Miami, a Doctor of Musical Arts from the University of Michigan, and began teaching at Catholic University in Washington D.C. before deciding to undertake the challenge of becoming a medical doctor. Although he obtained his M.D. and became a dermatologist, Dr. Baker never ceased performing, composing, teaching and recording.

In his early years as a musician, George Baker won first prizes by unanimous jury decision in several major organ competitions including the American Guild of Organists (Buffalo, 1970), the Grand Prix de Chartres (Chartres, France, 1974) and the International Improvisation Competition (Lyon, France, 1979). His recording credits include the complete organ works of J. S. Bach (1979) and the complete organ works of Louis Vierne (world premiere recording, released in 1997, a project he shared with Pierre Cochereau). He has been awarded three French Grand Prix du Disque, two of which were for The Complete Organ Works of Darius Milhaud. In 1995, the eight CD Vierne set won the coveted Grand Prix Spécial du Jury from the Nouvelle Académie du Disque Français. In 2000, the same recording won a critic's choice award from American Record Guide.

George Baker's compositions, published by H. T. Fitzsimmons, have been performed both in the United States and in Europe. Dr. Baker has served on juries in several prestigious organ competitions including the Grand Prix de Chartres in 2000, where he will return as a juror in 2004. Special areas of interest include the music of Louis Vierne and Maurice Duruflé, improvisation in the French style, and the organ building of Cavaillé-Coll. He is also in frequent demand as a consultant for organ building projects.


George Baker first appeared on the roster of Karen McFarlane Artists as a young artist, to which he returned at the beginning of the new millennium. He will be a featured artist at the 2004 AGO National Convention in Los Angeles. □

JUSTIN RUBIN PLAYS AT DULUTH CATHEDRAL

Dr. Justin Rubin, UMD Music Department faculty member, will play a recital, co-sponsored by the American Guild of Organists – Arrowhead Chapter, at the Cathedral Of Our Lady Of The Rosary, 2801 E. 4th Street, Duluth, Minn. On **Sunday, February 15 at 3:00 pm**. The concert features Renaissance, Baroque, Romantic and Contemporary compositions by Bruhns, Buxtehude, Distler, Fischer, Parker, Reger, Russell, Scheidt, Sweelinck and Widor. Admission to the concert is free and open to the public; a \$5 donation is suggested to benefit the Cathedral Concert Series and Music Ministry. A reception will follow the program.

Dr. Justin Rubin currently serves as Assistant Professor Theory/Composition and Organ/Piano, and supervises Computer Music Center at the University of Minnesota, Duluth campus. Initially educated under the tutelage of his father, he pursued formal training at the Manhattan School of Music Preparatory Division between 1986-89, studying piano with Philip Kawin. In 1992, Rubin earned a Bachelor's degree *Summa Cum Laude*, and in 1994, a Master of Fine Arts in composition from the State University of New York at Purchase. There, he studied composition under Dary John Mizelle, Richard Cameron-Wolfe and Alvin Brehm, and was awarded the *B'nai B'rith Composition Prize* for a Holocaust memorial piece, *Shalom Rav*, for organ and narrator.

Following a 1994 Fulbright Scholarship in Organ Musicology to Denmark, Rubin was appointed Interim Choir Director and Organist at New York City's famous Holy Trinity Lutheran Church. Prior to his 1998 appointment to the UMD Music Department Faculty, he spent from '95-'98 in residence at the University of Arizona under the guidance of Daniel Asia, completing his DMA degree in composition. In 1996, Dr. Rubin was invited to play an all-Distler organ recital at New York's famed St. Thomas Church. Organ teachers have included Pamela Decker, Robert Fertitta and David Burton Brown. □
