Yvonne Thomas, resident musician and a member of our TCAGO Program Committee, will demonstrate its twenty-six stops. Like all of the instruments in this 'crawl', the Walker represents an 'average church organ', but one done with flair.

Next, a pair of electro-pneumatic instruments. At 10AM we'll visit with Sharon Vicic and the three-manual 39-stop, 1984 Holtkamp organ at **Arlington Hills Lutheran Church** (1115 Greenbriar Street), and from there continue (11AM) to **First Covenant Church** (1280 Arcade Street), where Pat Kohnen will show how the three-manual, 41-stop, 1981 Moeller organ is used during services. We'll even get a chance to sing along.

After a lunch break (noon-1:15PM), we'll reconvene (1:30PM) at **Arlington Hills United Methodist Church** (759 County Road B East, just up Arcade Street). Lawrence Phelps designed and built this 2-manual, 30-stop, 40 rank organ in 1978 after his stint at Casavant, when he had gone into business for himself (a brief, ill-fated run, unfortunately). 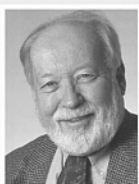

and to be in the form of a business meeting followed by a supper and a discussion.

Various suggestions were offered relative to talks, lectures, recitals, public services, etc., but no formal action was taken with reference thereto.

Here is a luncheon meeting from February 13, 1932 where Sigfrid Karg-Elert and his daughter were introduced.

The Minnesota Chapter of the A.G.O. and Stanley R. Avery met at the Curtis Hotel of Minneapolis on Saturday, Feb. 13, for a luncheon in honor of Dr. Sigfrid Karg-Elert and his daughter, who is accompanying him on his tour. At the close, Mr. Avery presented Miss Karg-Elert with Valentine greetings from the Guild. Dr. Karg-Elert spoke of some of his experiences with American organs at the beginning of his recital tour. The luncheon was well attended by organists who already were acquainted with Dr. Karg-Elert through his compositions.

On November 18, 1935, our AGO Chapter celebrated its twenty-fifth anniversary. From the minutes of that meeting



ARCHIVE NEWS

Our archives identify and preserve records of long-term value. They mirror the activities and the settings of the TCAGO and provide answers to the basic questions: who did what, when, why and how? Consider a portion of the minutes from our first meeting on November 23, 1910:

The first meeting of the Minnesota Chapter of the American Guild of Organists was held Wednesday evening, November 23, 1910 in the Chapel of the Church of St. John the Evangelist, St. Paul. The meeting was called to order at 8:15 with Mr. G. H. Fairclough in the chair, and ten organists in attendance.

After some explanatory remarks concerning the Guild, - its aims, etc., the Chairman read several letters from the Warden in New York leading up to the formation of a chapter in Minnesota.

It was decided that the Twin Cities be the center of the Chapter and that the meetings be held alternately in St. Paul and Minneapolis, at some hotel or café,

taken by Secretary Henry Engen, here is another example of our preserved history:

The Minnesota Chapter of the American Guild of Organists celebrated its twenty-fifth anniversary on Monday evening, November eighteenth, at the Church of St. John the Evangelist, St. Paul, where this chapter was organized. In spite of inclement weather, forty-one members and guests were present at a turkey dinner served in the parish-house by the ladies of the church and arranged by Mrs. G. H. Fairclough.

Mr. Fairclough spoke of the academic progress made in this chapter, seventeen members having passed examinations, four holding the F.A.G.O. and thirteen the A.A.G.O. certificate. Of the fourteen deans during the twenty-five years seven were present at this meeting. Before adjourning for the recital in the sanctuary, Mr. Fairclough called upon a visiting guest, Richmond Skinner, the son of Ernest M. Skinner, who responded with a brief greeting.

The program in the church sanctuary was given by George H. Fairclough, F.A.G.O., organist and choirmaster of the Church of St. John the Evangelist, assisted by his pupil, Henry Brooks, organist of the First Baptist Church, St. Paul, and Charles Johnson, boy soloist of St. John's choir.

The minutes of these significant meetings from our organization's past have been edited. If you're interested in reading more or in looking at other items from our archives, visit the Minnesota History Center Library (level two) Tuesday-Saturday in St. Paul. Except for an hourly parking fee, there's no charge to use the library and you don't have to be a member of the Minnesota Historical Society. □



He has been the winner of the John Cerevalo Prize for "Excellence in the Performance of the Music of Johann Sebastian Bach" and has been a prize winner in the national improvisation competition of the American Guild of Organists. His skill in this art has evoked the enthusiastic endorsement of audiences, fellow musicians and critics.

As a composer, he has written compositions for string orchestra, woodwinds, organ, piano, voice and chorus. Now devoting all his time to performance, Dr. Turk is traveling internationally for concert engagements. This season he will again be playing throughout the United States and in Europe. He has appeared in concert as orchestral conductor, choral conductor and composer, as well as performer on organ, harpsichord and piano.

He has made television appearances in concert and has appeared as recitalist at national and regional conventions of the American Guild of Organists. He has appeared at music conferences as both lecturer and performer.

A graduate of the famed Curtis Institute of Music, where he studied with Alexander McCurdy, he also studied with New York composer and organist McNeil Robinson at the Manhattan School of Music, earning the Master's degree with honors, and the Doctor of Musical Arts, with honors.

Turk's most recent CD released by Dorian Recordings, entitled "Ocean Grove: French Spectaculars on the Great Ocean Grove Auditorium Organ" has been critically acclaimed. This year he is working on the preparations for upcoming CD recordings.

In January 2000 his composition "Elegy" for string orchestra and oboe was performed live on television in Japan. He has made two concert tours to Japan, playing fourteen recitals.

He is also Founder and Artistic Director of the Summer Stars Chamber Music Festival in Ocean Grove, New Jersey, which is now in its tenth season, and organist and choirmaster of St. Mary's Episcopal Church in Wayne, PA. He taught at West Chester University, West Chester, Pennsylvania, from 1992-2000 as Professor of Organ. He has served as the Dean of the Philadelphia chapter of the American Guild of Organists, and is currently Educational Coordinator for Region III of the American Guild of Organists.
