



The ORGAN HISTORICAL SOCI-ETY Organ Database has recently gone online and now is open to and accessible by the public. More than 19,000 individual organs are listed in the database, primarily in the USA and Canada.

The database is available at the OHS website: http://www.organsociety.org. Simply click on 'OHS Pipe Organ Database' in the left-column navigation bar and search either for a particular instrument or a general listing by state or city.



This database information has been collected over a considerable period of time. Inevitably, some of the listings are now out-of-date, for various reasons (the information was incorrect to begin with, the instrument has been moved-altered-destroyed).

As you might guess, a database of this kind is only as good as the information on it, and each of you is encouraged to visit the database and submit corrections/additions such as are known to you. It is best if you have first-hand knowledge of the instrument(s) for which you make these changes, else you perpetuate incomplete or incorrect information.

North Dakota Organist Featured in House of Hope Recital

The House of Hope MUSIC AT FOUR SERIES 2005-2006 will open Sunday, **October 9** at **4:00 pm** when organist Christopher Anderson is presented in recital. Outstanding performer and Reger scholar, Anderson is Associate Professor of Music at the University of North Dakota. His program will include: Anton Heiler *Tanz-Toccata;* Shostakovich *Prelude and Fugue No. 20 in C Minor* (trans. Christopher Anderson); Scheidt *Echo ad manuale duples forte & Iene*, SSWV 128; Reger *Chorale Prelude "Aus tiefer Not schrei ich zu dir";* William Albright *The King of Instruments*, Dean Billmeyer, narrator.

Dr. Anderson is the author of *Max Reger and Karl Straube: Perspectives on an Organ Performing Tradition* published by Ashgate, and a new book, *Selected Writings of Max Reger* which will be published by Routledge. In addition to his teaching and writing, he maintains an active performance schedule as an organist with a repertory that ranges from the sixteenth century to the newest music for the organ.

The recital, which is free of charge and open to the public, will be preceded by a carillon prelude at 3:30 pm played by David Johnson, House of Hope carillonneur. The church is located at 797 Summit Avenue, St. Paul.

2006 Student Scholarship Competition

TCAGO will hold its annual student competition on Saturday, April 22, 2006 at Augustana Lutheran Church, 1400 South Robert Street in West St Paul. Students will be performing on the newly-installed 39 stop, 2 manual Glatter-Gotz/ Rosales organ. The instrument has mechanical key action and electric stop action (with memory including sequencer). Competitors must be under 23 years of age as of August 1, 2006 and must reside (either home or school) in AGO Region VI: Minnesota, Iowa, Wisconsin, North Dakota, South Dakota, Nebraska, Kansas, Missouri, Colorado or eastern Wyoming. Membership in the AGO is not required.

The 1st prize of \$1,500 is sponsored by the Schubert Club of St. Paul. The \$900 2nd prize is sponsored by TCAGO member Philip Asgian.

- J. S. Bach (choose one of the following):
 C Major Toccata (Adagio and Fugue) BWV 564
 F Minor Prelude and Fugue BWV 534
 A Minor Prelude and Fugue BWV 543
- 2. A work of the competitor's choice written before 1930
- 3. A work of the competitor's choice written after 1930
- 4. Hymn (choose one)

Introduce the hymn and play two stanzas as though accompanying a congregation. One stanza must be played in a standard four-part setting; published or improvised arrangements may be used for the introduction and/or other stanza.





Massimo Nosetti, born in Alessandria (Italy) in 1960, studied organ, composition, choral music and direction and polyphonic composition at the National Conservatories of Turin and Milan. Afterward, he studied organ with P. Pidoux and J. Langlais. Currently he is Professor of Organ and Composition at the National Conservatory in Cuneo and since 1981 has been titular organist at the Basilica of Santa Rita in Turin. Also from 1979 to 1994, he was Director of Music at the Turin Cathedral.

He frequently gives organ recitals, lectures and master classes in all European countries, the USA, Canada, Mexico, South America, Japan, Korea, Hong Kong, Australia and New Zealand. He has composed and published many works for organ, choir, and orchestra. His "Ecce Lignum Crucis," and orchestral work commissioned for the exhibition of the Holy Shroud in 1998 and 2000, has been performed and recorded by the RAI – Italian Radio Symphonic Orchestra.

He also is interested in the aspects of organ-building and church music as a member of the Diocesan Commission of Sacred Music and as a consultant of the National Commission for Sacred Music. From 1999 to 2004 he was Vice-President of the Italian Association of St. Cecilia and at present he is dean of the organ department of this association. Olivier Latry, titular organist at Notre-Dame Cathedral (Paris, France) will present a solo organ recital at Pilgrim Congregational Church in Duluth, Minnesota on **Wednesday**, **Octrober 26** at **7:30 pm**. The recital is on the Jaeckel organ, built in 1988 by Duluth organ builder Dan Jaeckel. The organ is one of the finest tracker organs in the region.

The recital features repertoire by French composers and includes works by Louis-Nicolas Clerambault, Francois Couperin, César Franck, Louis Vierne, Jehan Alain, Olivier Messiaen, Maurice Duruflé and an improvisation by Mr. Latry.

Olivier Latry is one of the world's most distinguished organist, not only in France, but in the international community as well. He began his study of the organ

at age 12 and later attended the Academy of Music at St. Maur-des-Fossés, studying organ with Gaston Litaize. At age 23 he won a competition to become one of the three titular organists of the Cathedral of Notre-Dame in Paris. From 1990-1995 he taught organ at the Academy of Music at St. Maur-des-Fossés, where he succeeded his

teacher, Gaston Litaize. Since 1995 he has taught at the Paris Conservatory, where he has succeeded Michel Chapuis.

In addition to concerts and teaching, Mr. Latry has made his mark through

Not wishing to specialize in a particular repertoire, Olivier Latry would like to be an ambassador of seventeenth to twenty-first century French organ music, hence his equal

devotion to the art of improvisation. Today he is counted among the most noted "improvisateurs" in the exceptional French tradition from Charles Tournemire to Pierre Couchereau.

Latry has performed in more than forty countries on five continents, appearing most often in the United States. He has made special trips to appear for regional and national conventions of the American Guild of Organists as well as for inaugural recitals of new instruments and for major music festivals and summer schools.

Mr. Latry has a particular interest in contemporary music and has premiered works of Xavier Darasse, Claude Ballif, Thierry Pecout, Vincent Paulet, Theirry Escaich and Jean-Louis Florentz.
