n Friday, November 4 at 7:30 pm organist Paul Jacobs will play the inaugural recital on the Glatter-Götz/Rosales organ at Augustana Lutheran Church, West St Paul. Mr. Jacobs is head of the organ department at the Juilliard School, New York City. He is acclaimed as "one of the most supremely gifted young organists of his generation" (Chicago Tribune) and "a stylish musician of great taste and refinement" as well as "a charismatic showman" (Atlanta Journal-Constitution).

Organ builder Caspar von Glatter-Götz and tonal designer/voicer Manuel Rosales have collaborated on three organs previous to the Augustana instrument, with the most recent being the organ in the Walt Disney Concert Hall in Los Angeles. The Augustana organ has 2 manuals, 39 stops, mechanical key action and electric stop action. The case was designed by Graham Tristram, Edinburgh, Scotland. Acoustician Dana Kirkegaard, Chicago, modified the sanctuary's acoustics.

Augustana Lutheran Church is located at 1400 S. Robert Street, West St Paul. There is no admission charge for the recital. \Box

Mr. Stroh earned the BA Mus, concentration in organ performance, from Saint John's University, Collegeville, Minnesota, where he studied with

Kim R. Kasling, AMusD, Professor of Music and Director of Liturgical Music Studies and Organist of the Basilica of Saint Mary, Minneapolis, Minnesota. Mr. Stroh is currently a candidate for the MA degree in Liturgical Music at the Saint John's University School of Theology where he continues studies with Dr. Kasling. \square

Jean Sarah Malkames Barone passed to her reward on September 5, 2005, aged 94. She was born July 21, 1911 in Kingston, Pennsylvania, the oldest of four children of Robert Bruce and Sarah Lazarus Malkames. She graduated from Syracuse University in 1933 (a member of Kappa Kappa Gamma sorority), taught art in the school systems of Milford, Pennsylvania (1935 – 1938) and Ossining, New York (1938) - 1944), where Peter Falk was one of her students...note that he must have learned something, as he is a pretty good artist himself: (http://peterfalk.com/Default.htm). Married to Michael J. Barone in 1943, she returned to Kingston to raise her family (sons J. Michael, of Saint Paul, Minnesota, and Christopher P., of Kingston), but later earned a degree in library science and was head of the children's section of the Hoyt Library in Kingston, where she worked from 1958 to 1983. With husband Mike, she relocated to Green Valley, Arizona in 1983 and, a year after his death, in 1996 relocated once again, to West Saint Paul, Minnesota, where she lived near her eldest son. She will be missed by the many who knew and loved her.



Archive News George H. Fairclough, Our First Dean

On November 10, 2005 the TCAGO will celebrate its 95th anniversary. This month's Archive News focuses on our first Dean, George Fairclough, born in Hamilton, Ontario Canada on January 30, 1869.

A portrait of Mr. Fairclough is in the Minnesota History Center Library (B. C. Golling Historical Collection of portraits). Behind the portrait, there are biographical notes that are signed and dated May 25, 1917. Here are a few entries from those notes...

- Schools: Royal Academy, Berlin; University of Toronto; Macalester College (Master of Music)
- Military Record: Queen's Own Rifles, Toronto, 1888
- Came to Minnesota on January 1, 1901 [His first positions in the U. S. were at St. Luke's Episcopal Church and Head of the Musical Faculty of Kalamazoo College, Kalamazoo, Michigan 1895-1900]
- Married to Helen M. Freeman at Grand Rapids, Michigan on September 22, 1897. [By 1917, the marriage had been blessed with five children—two daughters, Helen and Edith, and three sons, Gordon, George Jr. and James.]
- Business address: 802, Pittsburgh Building, St. Paul
- Home address: 844 Fairmont Ave., St. Paul

Besides the portrait notes, a significant source of information about George Fairclough is in the series *Minnesota Musicians of the Cultured Generation*. Robert T. Laudon, the author, is a Professor Emeritus of Musicology at the University of Minnesota. One of the titles in this series of 15 is "George H. Fairclough, Dean of Organists." (This series is in the Minnesota History Center Library and includes essays on two other founders of our local AGO, Stanley Avery and J. Victor Berquist.)

On January 1, 1901, George Fairclough became organist-choirmaster at the Church of St. John the Evangelist. Less than ten years later, St. John's was the setting for our first AGO meeting. He served at St. John's until his retirement on July 1, 1943. He also served for 18 years as organist-choirmaster at Mt. Zion Temple. He taught piano, organ and theory and joined the faculty of Macalester College. He was there for 25 years. He achieved the rank of Fellow in the AGO in 1916. Two years later, he was hired at the University of Minnesota eventually becoming University Organist and Professor of Organ. He was at the U. of M. from 1918 through 1937.

Every Friday for ten years, Mr. Fairclough gave weekly organ recitals over the University radio station WLB (later KUOM). He was at the University during the planning and installation of the 108-rank Aeolian-Skinner organ at Northrup Auditorium, 1932-1935.

In the spring of 1902, George Fairclough presided at the Hill House organ where he played for the wedding of Ruth Hill, daughter of James J. Hill. One of the pieces he played was the William Tell Overture of Rossini. He played it again as his final piece on a program at the 1904 St. Louis World's Fair.

He was a composer of published service music, organ music, piano music and songs. Many of his scores are available at the St. Paul Public Library.

When George Fairclough retired from St. John the Evangelist in 1943, he and his wife Helen left Minnesota and moved to San Francisco to be near their daughter, Helen Elizabeth Fairclough Barnett. He continued to play concerts for the AGO and to substitute in churches, particularly at Grace Episcopal Cathedral. On November 17, 1946, just when her husband was playing services at the cathedral, Mrs. Fairclough had a stroke. She passed away in the morning of the 18th.

In Santa Clara, California, George died almost eight years later on March 27, 1954. He was 85.

For more detail, photos and even a portrait, I'd recommend reading Dr. Laudon's (noted above) thirty-seven page essay. As organists in this area, we are blessed with a rich history of organs and organists.

Evensong and the Fauré Requiem

The choir of Saint John the Evangelist Episcopal Church in Saint Paul will be joined by the choir of Trinity Episcopal Church in Excelsior for Evensong on the Sunday after All Saints Day, November 6, at 4:00 pm. After the service the choirs will sing the Requiem of Gabriel Fauré, with organ accompaniment by James Frazier, assisted by harp and solo violin. Linda Zeliq will be the soprano soloist for the Pie Jesu. Andrea Schussler will conduct.

The church is located at 60 Kent Street, one block east of Dale and one block north of Summit. Off-street parking is available at Summit and Kent. A free-will offering will be received to benefit the Winifred Bean Evensong Fund, and a reception will follow the service, to which all are cordially invited.

This will be the last service to be played from Saint John's Moller console, which was built in 1950 for the 1992 E.M. Skinner organ. A new four-manual Schantz console will be installed in the following week, which will be prepared to play a restored and enhanced Skinner. A capital campaign is now underway for the future work of re-voicing ranks altered by Moller, such as the tuba, for returning ranks to their original chests, for constructing replica ranks lost in 1950, such as the 16' pedal trombone with wooden resonators, and for adding new ranks consistent with the Skinner esthetic, chorus, and a flauto mirabilis in the solo division. An antiphonal organ will be added to the balcony as part of this phase 2, which will be completed in the next few years. The church's elegantly carved organ facades, unique in the Twin Cities, were designed by Robert Hope-Jones for the organ he constructed for the parish in 1911.

Concert Celebrates 80th Anniversary of Casavant!

To celebrate the 80th anniversary of Casavant organ No. 1091, organist Winston Kaehler will present a recital at Dayton Avenue Presbyterian Church on Sunday, November 13 at 4:00 pm.

The Dayton Avenue organ is one of the oldest and finest surviving Casavant instruments in this region and represents a fusion of French and English design elements. Claver Casavant, one of the original Casavant brothers who studied with the great French organbuilder Aristide Cavaillé-Coll, evidently visited St. Paul to take part in voicing during its installation. Jean-Louis Coignet, former head of the French government commission in charge of restoring historic Parisian organs, has praised this instrument saying, "Its poetry is beautiful."



The Johnson Opus 499 was built in 1877 for St. Mary of the Sacred Heart Church in Boston. When St. Mary's building was slated for demolition in 1975, the School Sisters of Notre Dame rescued the organ and placed it in the chapel of their provincial house in Mankato. In 1994, the sisters committed themselves to a restoration of the organ, which comprises 45 stops and 2, 995 pipes.

Having won several prizes at major international organ competitions since 2002, László Fassang has quickly established himself as a major young talent in the international organ world. Most recently he was the 2004 winner of the coveted Grand Prix de Chartres. He also was the 2002 Improvisation Gold Medal winner at the Royal Bank Calgary International Organ Festival and Competition (August 2002), and the winner of the Deuxieme Grand Prix d'improvisation as well as the Duruflé prize at the 4th International Competition of the City of Paris (November 2002).

A native of Budapest, László Fassang was born into a musical family and began to study the organ at age of 13 under the tutelage of István Baróti. He graduated from the Franz Liszt Academy of Music in 1998, having studied piano under Ilona Prunyi and organ with István Ruppert. Mr. Fassang then entered the Paris Conservatory, where he studied organ with Olivier Latry and Michel Bouvard, as well as

improvisation under Loïc Mallié, Philippe Lefebvre and Thierry Escaich. In 1993, he won first prize at the Zoltán Gárdonyi Memorial Competition in Budapest, and in 1998 took second prize at the Györ International Organ Competition in Hungary.

In 2000, Mr. Fassang took a one-year sabbatical to become the resident organist at the Sapporo Concert Hall in Japan. During that time, he performed several concerts in Japan and recorded a CD on the Kern organ at Sapporo Concert Hall that included music of Bach and Liszt as well as his own improvisations. Since leaving Japan, he has performed concerts in France, Germany, Holland, Switzerland, Canada and USA.

Mr. Fassang currently divides his time between Hungary and Spain, where he teaches improvisation at the Musikene in San Sebastian. Performances by Mr. Fassang are especially interesting because his improvisational style demonstrates the versatility of the organ through the incorporation of jazz and folk music influences. \square


