

A New Schantz Organ for MOUNT OLIVET LUTHERAN CHURCH

The Schantz Organ Company has completed the installation of a new organ for Mount Ölivet Lutheran Church. It is a three-manual instrument of 5 divisions and 56 ranks. There are 51 ranks in the main organ and an additional 5 stops in the "choir" organ. The new Schantz replaces a 34rank Moller organ that dated from 1956 with additions in 1967. The Moller has been

Though the Moller organ served the congregation for nearly 50 years, it was in reality too small in size and scaling and suffered from its placement in chambers that were over 18 feet deep. In addition, the Choir loft had no direct organ sound, so singers had to be content with having the sound of the organ amplified into the loft. The new chambers are much smaller, only 5' deep on the north side of the nave (Pedal division), and the new Swell chamber (south side) is less than 7' deep even though the Swell is now 20 ranks in size, double the size of the old Swell.

One of the most important goals for this project, in addition to better leadership for congregational singing, was to provide some "live" organ sounds to support the singers in the choir loft. To accomplish this we built a 5-stop "Choir" division in a case that serves as the reredos for the side chapel and speaks directly into the choir loft. This a floating division and can be drawn to play on any manual or the Pedal.

The Great, Positiv, and Pedal organs are situated on cantilevered chests so that for the first time in the church's history pipes are now in the same room with the congregation. The Great has 12 ranks of Principals plus a 16'/8' Violone. This provides the backbone resources necessary for the accompaniment of Lutheran hymn singing. The Swell, being the only expressive division, is well developed with two sets of celestes, a full battery of reeds, including a Vox Humana and a Festival Trumpet on 15" of wind pressure.

The organ was used for the first time on Rally Sunday this past September and was dedicated during Sunday morning services and an afternoon concert on October 9th. Kraig Windschitl is the resident organist and Dr. Beverly Claflin is the Director of Music.

New Piece in the Big Apple—TCAGO Member News

Lynn Trapp performed the premiere of his own organ work in recital at St. Patrick's Cathedral, New York City, on Sunday, October 16, 2005. Cardinal Egan and the music ministry of St. Patrick's commissioned Dr. Trapp to compose the piece for a new chant and organ CD recording to be made at the cathedral. The Cardinal was given several chants from which to choose as the basis of the organ work, and the Exsultet Chant was selected. *Images of the Exsultet Chant of the Great Paschal Vigil* is a seven minute work which depicts the ritual, environment and chant experienced during the opening service of light in the Easter Vigil Service of the Roman Rite. The work is published by World Library Publications.

Mr. Tate plans to record a CD of his favorite piano and organ music used for worship services, which should be available within a few months. \square

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

Dixon made her professional debut with the Minnesota Orchestra at the invitation of Sir Neville Marriner. Since that

time, she has conducted extensive concert tours of Europe and Japan. She now performs over fifty concerts a year in the USA and abroad as a soloist (both on piano and organ), accompanist, director of Emmanuel Brass, and pianist for the Chamberlain Trio. "A great show," "exciting," "dazzled," and "fantastic" are but a few of the words used by audience members to describe hearing pianist and organist Joan De-Vee Dixon.

Dr. Dixon is an Associate Professor of Music at Frostburg State University in Frostburg, Maryland, and Organist and Music Director at the historic Emmanuel Parish in Cumberland, Maryland. She holds bachelors and masters degrees from Drake University, and a doctor of musical arts degree from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. In 1992, Pendragon Press published her 700-page bio-bibliography of American composer George Rochberg. In 1998, she was named a recipient of the Maryland State Arts Council's Individual Artist Award.

The WAMSO Young Artist Competition was created by WAMSO in 1956 under the leadership of its first president, Rosalynd Pflaum. For fifty years, it has offered young artists (25 years and younger) an opportunity to showcase their musical talents on any instrument that has a permanent chair in the Minnesota Orchestra and to compete for cash prizes, scholarships and performances. Winners of this prestigious competition have gone on to perform in venues all over the world. In fact, there are four former winners playing with the Minnesota Orchestra today.

Works on the program include (tentatively): the American Premiere of "Fantasy and Faith at Oxford" by Emma Lou Diemer; a set of spirituals by various composers including

Rosalie Bonighton, Libby Larsen, Stephen Paulus and Ms. Dixon herself, and arrangements by Ms. Dixon of selections from "The Sound of Music" and Scott Joplin's "Palm Leaf Rag."

The organ was moved from the Ringling home to St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Baraboo where it served for many decades. In the 1990s, the church sought other musical (or semi-musical) sources. Though attempts were made to save the organ, it was given a "Farewell Concert" on September 28, 2003 and then removed under the supervision of Paul Snyderr of Baraboo. The dismantled organ was sold at auction to Todd Peterson of Minneapolis and then moved to storage at the Hendrickson Organ Company of St. Peter, Minnesota. It is for sale, and bids are being accepted.

The organ occupies a floor space c. 16' x 16' and a height of 17'. A large new laukhuff blower was installed in 1994. Otherwise, it is all original.

RINGLING HOME PIPE ORGAN

The name Ringling is forever associated with the circus, and the Ringling home in Baraboo, Wisconsin was an imposing edifice representing the fame and wealth of the family. In 1899, a 24-rank pipe organ was installed in the home — a large and early installation of a home organ in the USA.

The organ was built by Farrand & Votey of Detroit and is their opus 758. It has two 61-note manuals and a 30-note pedal. All of the manual ranks, except the Great Open Diapason 8', are enclosed in a single expression box. The firm had pur-

chased the patents of the Roosevelt Organ Company, and the Ringling home chests are of Roosevelt style.

Farrand & Votey became associated with the Aeolian Company as well as Hutchings for whom E. M. Skinner worked. Skinner would later become Vice President of the new Hutchings-Votey firm. A founder of the Austin Organ Company, John Austin, worked for Farrand & Votey before starting the Austin firm with his brother Basil.

The Ringling home organ is unusual in being built as a tracker-pneumatic instrument. The key and stop action are tracker, but the chests are pneumatic. This is not exactly the same action as the famous Felgemaker organ in Duluth, but they are distinctly related in this period of transitional designs.


