

Acclaimed Bach Performer comes to House of Hope

On Sunday, April 23 at 4:00 pm, the House of Hope Music At Four Series will present organist John Butt in an all-Bach recital. Dr. Butt is an internationally acclaimed Bach performer and scholar, and is Gardiner Chair and Head of the Music Department at the University of Glasgow. He is an active performer as choral conductor, organist, harpsichordist and musical director, and has recorded extensively on organ, harpsichord and clavichord.



As an undergraduate at Cambridge University, John Butt held the office of organ scholar at King's College. Continuing as a graduate student, he made an intensive study of the music of Bach, receiving his PhD in 1987. He was subsequently a lecturer at the University of Aberdeen, a Fellow of Magdalene College Cambridge, and he joined the faculty at the University of California, Berkeley in 1989 as University Organist and Assistant Professor of Music. In 1997 he returned to Cambridge as a university lecturer and Fellow of King's College.

This performance will be a return engagement for Dr. Butt who played a recital at House of Hope in June, 2000 in observance of the 250th anniversary of the death of J. S. Bach. His program will include the following:


TCAGO Members Co-direct the Liturgical Music Conference

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Frederick Hohman in Concert at St. Andrew's

Fred Hohman, concert organist, performs at St. Andrew's Lutheran Church, 900 Stillwater Road in Mahtomedi on Monday evening, April 3 at 7:00 pm.



Frederick Hohman

Acclaimed as one of America's finest touring concert organists, Fred Hohman

makes his performance debut on the St. Andrew's 1927, 7310-pipe IV/108 Casavant/Schantz pipe organ. Although he is best known for his vivid organ transcriptions of symphonic works, his program will also include selections from his forthcoming all-Widor compact disc recorded on the St. Andrew's organ.

Several facets of the organ world are positively influenced by Frederick Hohman. Active as a touring organ virtuoso since 1984, he has appeared as guest recitalist before various organ trade conventions, at noted churches, cathedrals, universities and music festivals, has presided over the inauguration of some of America's largest and noteworthy new and restored pipe organs, and has appeared as organ soloist with symphony orchestras in the East and Midwest. His travels throughout America from 1992 to 2001 were augmented by collaborations with organists and choirs when he served as producer/engineer on over 150 Pro Organo CD recordings, and as producer/host on over 2 dozen episodes of the Midnight Pipes television/home video series.

A native of St. Louis, Missouri, with a background in both classical music and jazz, Frederick Hohman took the Performer's Certificate and all academic degrees (Mus.B., MM, and DMA) with David Craighead at the Eastman School of Music. In 1984, he won First Prize in both the Arthur Poister Organ Competition as well as the Eighth national Organ-Playing Competition (Mader Foundation, Pasadena, California). His 1986 doctoral essay and first CD recordings centered upon the symphonic organ era and Edwin Lemare, but his broader discography, which draws frequent airplay and editorial from broadcasters and music critics in America and England, reveals considerable expertise in all areas of organ literature.

The concert is free and open to all. An offering will be received and a reception will follow the program. St. Andrew's is located just over one mile north of Highway 36 on Hilton Trail, just east of the 694/36 junction. More information can be found at www.saintandrews.org or by phone at 651-426-3261. □

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
