ORGAN HISTORICAL SOCIETY INAUGURATES "PHOENIX PROJECT" TO HELP RELOCATE ORGANS TO CHURCHES IN NEED

Here's a unique opportunity, launched by the Organ Historical Society to help congregations in need, including those on the Gulf coast devastated by Katrina, and beyond.

Natural disasters, accidents, and arson have taken a terrible toll on American houses of worship. To help affected churches and synagogues rebuild, the non-profit Organ Historical Society, in cooperation with the Organ Clearing House, announces the Phoenix Project, an initiative aimed at relocating suitable organs from buildings that have closed. Across the country, redundant organs of excellent quality are currently available to suit the needs of worship, and experts in organ building and restoration stand ready to provide advice and referrals without charge.

If you have information on instruments that are no longer in use and may be able to serve congregations in need or know of congregations that are in need of an instrument, please pass this along.






Charlie Balogh will perform in concert on the Wurlitzer theater pipe organ on Saturday, June 17 at 8:00 pm at The Phipps Center for the Arts in Hudson, Wisconsin.

Balogh's program, *Hollywood to Broadway*, will include themes from *The Lord of the Rings* and the Harry Potter films as well as selections from *Chicago*, *Les Miserables*, *A Chorus Line*, *Cabaret* and *Oklahoma*.

For over 30 years, Balogh has delighted sold-out audiences with his performances on the Wurlitzer theater pipe organ at Organ Stop Pizza in Mesa, Arizona, as well as the Roaring 20s and Good Time Charley's restaurants in Grand Rapids, Michigan. In addition to his schedule at Organ Stop Pizza, Balogh maintains an active concert schedule throughout the United States and abroad, including Canada, England and Australia. For eight years he was a featured artist at the Century II Civic Center in Wichita as part of the Wichita River Festival. He has also performed on three separate occasions for the American Theatre Organ Society's (ATOS) national conventions and for the most recent regional convention in Phoenix. He was honored as organist of the year by ATOS in 2000. Balogh has also recorded a number of very successful albums.

This exciting and dynamic performer has won the praise of reviewers for being innovative and setting new standards of performance and repertoire. His style stems from a love of jazz and the music of the 30s and 40s along with classical influences and a broad background in traditional theater organ techniques.


