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Dean's Column



Greetings to All!

Every year it happens. Every year it thrills. It's so simple - four tones- a diminished seventh chord - the mystery of black dots on a page turning into a spinetingling moment. Columns of air vibrate in the organ pipes; hu-

man vocal cords vibrate magically matching pitches with hundreds of other voices. It's David Willcocks' incomparable setting of O Come All Ye Faithful.

Every year it happens. Every year it thrills. It's so simple - shorter, cooler days - the mystery of green leaves turning into dazzling autumn-hued foliage. The trees stop manufacturing chlorophyll; other leaf pigments become prominent. It's fall colors in the St. Croix River Valley.

Last Sunday we were biking from Marine-on-St. Croix to Scandia enjoying the 80 degree day and the spectacular colors. During one of the uphill climbs, (made easier by viewing the gorgeous grove of trees on the left) I became very aware of the sound of the wind blowing through a corn field on the right. I realized I was surrounded by color and wind, the same phenomena that surround me when playing the organ...colors in tone and wind blowing through a field of pipes. Music and nature, two gifts that keep my world on its axis, combined powerfully in that moment and in that metaphor.

The balanced architecture of a Bach fugue, the supple melodies of César Franck, the sensuous harmonies of Duruflé, the rhythmic drive of Kenneth Leighton, the dazzle of a French toccata. What magic occurs to lift these notes from the score into the souls of listeners? What goes through your mind when you make your best music? For me, nothing and everything...the mind is free from the concern of playing the right note at the right time. The kinesthetic memory of the fingers and feet insures accuracy. Acquired technique and scholarship facilitate interpretation. The tangible, visual symbols, all those dots on the page, become aural perceptions. Yet, it is not sterile sound waves exciting the ear membranes that create a powerful experience. It is the musician's inner life with the music. It is in giving oneself to the music and then in sharing it with others that grace is revealed and hearts are stirred. People ask if I feel a sense of power playing the organ. The answer is simply, "No." Music is about communicating, sometimes in whispers, sometimes in roars, always with passion and commitment. It is about becoming part of something larger than any time or any place. And it is experiencing every time and every place converging into one moment. That is the nature of music, and come to think of it, the music of nature.



ALL SAINTS EVENSONG WITH REJOICE IN THE LAMB

The choirs of Saint John the Evangelist Episcopal Church in St. Paul will present an Evensong at Saint John's on All Saints Sunday, **November 5** at **4:00 pm**. The choirs will be directed by Jacob Manier, with organist James Frazier. The organ prelude will feature the *Passacaglia*, from the **Introduction**, **Passacaglia** and **Fugue** by Healey Willan.

After the service, the choirs will sing Benjamin Britten's *Rejoice in the Lamb*, to a text from "Jubilate Agno," an extended poem by the eighteenth-century poet Christopher Smart, partly written during his confinement in an asylum for the insane. The poem reflects not only his religious mania, but his quest for the meaning of creativity, rationality and irrationality.

Saint John's Episcopal Church is located at 60 Kent Street at Portland, in St. Paul. Off-street parking is available at Summit Avenue and Kent (a block east of Dale). A free-will offering will be received, and a festive reception will follow the service. The church is handicap accessible from Kent Street.

Many of you will remember Joyce Hilary, who was organist at Central Lutheran Church for many years, and who, with her husband sponsored many worthwhile Organ Symposia for our chapter, featuring prominent guest organists/lecturers. The following notice appeared in the *Star Tribune* on September 17, 2006.

Hilary, Joyce Memorial services for Joyce Hilary, 88, will be 3 PM Sunday, October 8, at Central Lutheran, the church she served as organist for a quarter century. She died September 6 at the Augustana Health Care Center. Mrs. Hilary was a Graduate of Cambridge High School and Gustavus Adolphus College. Other metropolitan area churches where she served as organist include Grace Lutheran, Apple Valley and Peace Presbyterian, St. Louis Park. With her late husband, Frederic Hilary, she shared leadership in the Minneapolis Madrigal Singers and the Frederic Hilary Chorale. Preceding her in death were her husband, her parents, Ted and Marie Westrom, and one sister, Billie Bestrom. She is survived by two sisters, Jean Miller and Betty Skold; one brother, John Westrom; four nieces and seven nephews. Suggested memorials include the churches named above, Gustavus Adolphus College or VocalEssence.



Organ and Art

Paul Jacobs, perhaps the most sought after organ recitalist of our time, will be in Minneapolis on **Saturday**, **November 18**, at **4:00 pm**, at Mount Olive Lutheran Church, 3045 Chicago Avenue. There is no admission charge, but a freewill offering will be accepted.

Preceding the recital, at 3:00, an exhibit entitled "The Ecstasy of the Forge: a show of sculptures, photographs, and drawings by Lynn Dobson" will open. This show uses the classical Greek metaphors of volcanic fire and the forge to describe the creative process and to become the source of inspiration for these works which ultimately serve to heal, redeem and express the artist. The works in this

show span a period from 1984 to the present and they deal with discovering that unseen, intangible being called the spirit of the subject of each piece. Dobson, one of today's leading organ builders, has completed several significant instruments recently, including the Fred J. Cooper Memorial Organ, the largest concert hall organ in America, at Philadelphia's Kimmel Center.

Paul Jacobs made musical history at the age of 23 when, on the 250th anniversary of the death of J.S. Bach in 2000, he played the composer's complete organ music in an 18-hour non-stop marathon in Pittsburgh. Today, Mr. Jacobs is one of America's most active organists with performances in North America, South America, Australia, Asia and Europe. He is also among the youngest faculty appointments at The Juilliard School, where he was named chair of the organ department in 2004.

The recital program will include Bach's *Trio Sonata in G Major*, *Sicilienne* and *Toccata* from **Suite**, **Op. 5** of Maurice Duruflé, *Fantasia for Organ* by John Weaver, *Prelude, Fugue and Variation* by César Franck, and the rarely performed, virtuosic *Fantasia and Fugue on BACH* by Max Reger.

The three-manual and pedal pipe organ of Mount Olive Lutheran Church was installed in 1966 by the Schlicker Organ

Company, Buffalo, New York. The specification was designed by Herman L. Schlicker and Paul Manz, Cantor of Mount Olive at the time. It includes thirty-nine independent registers and fifty-five ranks of pipes. A complete description may be found at the church's web site, www.mountolivechurch.org.

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
