The Phipps Center's Wurlitzer theater pipe organ, style 260 special, opus 1404, with a three-manual console, 16 ranks of pipes, six tuned

percussions, as well as sound effects, is one of the finest of its size in the country.

A gift to The Phipps Center from Hubbard Broadcasting and the Stanley Hubbard family, this organ was originally installed in the Capitol Theater in St. Paul in 1926. It was reinstalled in the KSTP Television Studios in the Twin Cities in 1957 and then moved to the Center in 1983.


Lynne Davis is a leading international concert organist whose career was launched by taking First Prize at the prestigious St. Albans International Organ Competition and has grown to bring honors such as being a featured artist at the centennial American Guild of Organists national convention in New York. She was also a featured artist at the 2004 na-

tional convention of the American Guild of Organists held in Los Angeles and recently appeared on the inaugural series of the new Casavant organ at Brick Presbyterian Church in New York City on her 2005 fall tour.

Davis is an associate professor of music at Wichita State University and the only woman and the first American organist to earn the French "Certificat d'Aptitude de Professeur d'Orgue" in 1994. Since 1997 she has served as professor of organ at the French National Regional Conservatory in Caen, France.

After graduating with honors from the University of Michigan where she studied with Robert Clark, Davis left for France to study with Marie-Claire Alain. While there, she earned a diploma under Jean Langlais at the Schola Cantorum in Paris and a diploma from the Ecole César Franck under Edouard Souberbielle. Further studies with Maurice and Marie-Madeleine Duruflé as well as other European master organists took place while she fulfilled her duties as Titular Organist at the Church of St. Peter and St. Paul in Clamart, near Paris. Ms. Davis later was appointed titular organist of the 1868 Cavaillé-Coll organ at the Church of St. Pierre in Dreux.

She was guest organist for several concerts with the Bloomington Symphony Orchestra, Arius Chamber Orchestra, Carpe Deum Choral Ensemble and the 75th Anniversary Worship Celebration of The Lutheran Hour.

Dr. Joan DeVee Dixon is a frequent guest organist at St. Michael's. She made her professional debut with the Minnesota Orchestra and Sir Neville Marriner and performs regularly throughout the USA, England, France, Germany, Switzerland, Austria, Italy, Israel, Palestine, Japan and the Czech Republic. Most recently, she has been the featured soloist for the 2008 "American Spring Festival" throughout the Czech Republic, sponsored by the US Embassy and the International Dvorak Festival. Her organ CD, "Raise the Roof!" was recorded and released at St. Michael's last year.

The pipe organ at St. Michael's is a Reuter, Opus 2093, first installed in 1988. with additions in 2003. The instrument is presently three St. Michael's Reuter organ manuals, with 50 ranks of



pipes, and is the featured instrument for the June 21, 2008, 7:30 pm, pre-convention concert of the AGO (American Guild of Organists) National Convention in Minneapolis this summer. The Bloomington Symphony Orchestra will join the organ for this "Organ with 75 Orchestra Players" spectacular concert. Tickets are \$10 at the door, students FREE. Organ for Eight! will feature some patriotic medleys, a silent movie, the 1812 Overture by Tchaikovsky, Suite Sunday by Emma Lou Diemer, and other audience favorites.


