I have just finished moving all the information I have on Twin Cities organs from a database to a web site I created to give us the ability to have more information on the organ, the church and any other information that we'd like to include. I also have the ability to place more pictures from each instrument. Right now I have basic information on 550 organs. I need several things from you.

1. I need every TCAGO member to go to the new site (http://web.me.com/rgreene) and proof-read the pages of the instruments you know about. I need to hear from every one of you. I need to hear about typos, any changes made, etc. I need dates and details. What I would like to have is the specification and dates of the original installation. When was it changed, how and by whom? Lots of pictures, please. I will return them. Send me copies of original documents if you can. My addresses are on every page of the new web site.

2. I need a small group of people who are willing to do research and documentation on the organs of the Twin Cities. The amount of work will depend on ow much work you want to do. The job will be contacting churches and institutions for documentation on their instruments. I've been cooperating with Dr. James Cook of the Organ Historical Society on documenting organs here for the national registry.

The information I would like to have for each instrument is as follows:

Name of the institution Address City and Zip Organ builder, opus, date, original specification, manuals, divisions, action, ranks, stops Pictures Changes to installation, what was done, who did it and when it was changed Specifications, manuals, divisions, action, ranks, stops Pictures Documentation: where did you get the information, is there documentation, where is it?

Filling in missing information will be greatly appreciated. Many thanks.

He has completed four European solo recital tours, including featured appearances in Helsinki, Sibelius Festival, Salzburg, Budapest, Krakow and Vienna (including two Vienna Festival Weeks programs). Kasling has appeared on MPR's Pipedreams several times and recorded on the Sonux Luxque, American Organ Archive and Liturgical Press labels. This past July three of his students were featured nationally on *Pipedreams* as well. As an author, Kasling has written more than twenty published articles, several of which are scholarly, including two now being published in Religion in Geschichte und Gegenwart, new encyclopedia of music. Kasling continues to serve as consultant to many churches on organ renovation and liturgical music topics. Admission is free. 4

# TCAGO Archive News "Marcel Dupré in the Twin Cities" by Jerry Bonstrom

Here are the first and last paragraphs of the Minnesota AGO minutes for October 19, 1929. The Dean was Frank Owen and the secretary was Myrtle Weed:

Members of the Minnesota Chapter of the A.G.O. and friends gathered together at a dinner to honor Monsieur and Madame Marcel Dupré, Saturday evening, October 19, 1929 at the Athletic Club.

Mr. Stanley Avery announced that seats would be reserved for the Guild members at the recital given by Marcel Dupré at St. Mark's Episcopal Church [Cathedral], Minneapolis, under St. Mark's Choir auspices, Sunday night, October 20.

Marcel Dupré died at age 85 on May 30, 1971. The **Minneapolis Star** noted the above recital in the June 5, 1971 report of his passing.

"Dupré first appeared here in 1929 at the Cathedral of St. Mark..."

The story, attributed to the late Stanley Avery, organist at the church, is that Dupré arrived in the afternoon, looked at the organ, tried a few chords and abruptly left—not to reappear until he sat down that evening to play a complete program from memory on an instrument with which he had only a few moments' familiarity.

It was a demonstration of both his prodigious memory and his remarkable talent for improvisation....

Dupré played in recital in the late 1940s at Central Lutheran Church and again in the early 1950s at the College of St. Catherine..."

Our archives note other celebrated organists who've been in our midst such as Sigfrid Karg-Elert. On February 14, 1932, he also played at St. Mark's Cathedral.

As a result of these competitions she has concertized extensively throughout the United States and Canada. Prior to St. Olaf, Catherine worked as Minister of Music at First Church of Christ in Glastonbury, Connecticut where she was responsible for seven choirs. She coauthored the book "Choristers' Training Program" for the Royal School of Church Music in America, a manual for childrens' choir education. A specialist in working with childrens choirs, Catherine has presented workshops at several church music conventions. Her advanced childrens' choir toured England in the summer of 2001, singing services at Ely Cathedral, Ripon Cathedral and York Minster.

# VOCALESSENCE AND JAZZ LEGEND DR. BILLY TAY-LOR REUNITE TO HONOR THE 80<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY OF DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.'S BIRTHDAY IN A PROGRAM DEDICATED TO HIS LIFE AND LEGACY

# Dr. Taylor makes a rare public appearance to perform *Peaceful Warrior* inspired by his personal journey with Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

VocalEssence will join forces with jazz legend Dr. Billy Taylor to celebrate the 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of one of the greatest leaders of all time, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. on **Sunday**, **February 15**, **2009** at the Ordway Center for the Performing Arts. The annual **WITNESS** concert, nationally recognized for its efforts to promote African American choral music to today's youth, will begin at 4:00 pm and feature Dr. Taylor and his band, the Billy Taylor Trio, with the VocalEssence Chorus and Ensemble Singers and orchestra under the direction of conductor Philip Brunelle.

The program highlight will be *Peaceful Warrior*, a three-movement work inspired by the words of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. that made a lasting impression on Dr. Taylor in the early sixties while attending a tribute concert with Dr. King. As Billy describes, "He was speaking to a teenager who asked him about heroes and he told the young man 'You should be proud to choose your hero, it's a matter of pride.' *A Matter of Pride* became the first movement of the suite. That same day, Dr. King told a woman who wanted to support him to do it, but in her own Connecticut town, 'If you are really concerned, then you should show it and do it right where you are.' So I wrote that down too; from those two phrases, the first and third movements of the piece came. I'm not a poet, not a great lyricist, but when I wrote this I was anxious for it to come out the way I felt it because this came from what Dr. King said."

First performed with VocalEssence in 1998, the work is as vital today as it was a decade ago. "It is a rare opportunity for a music organization to focus on the words of Martin Luther King, Jr. and do it with someone who knew him personally!" explains VocalEssence Artistic Director Philip Brunelle. "Billy Taylor's *Peaceful Warrior* is a work based on words that Billy heard Martin Luther King speak. VocalEssence wants to capture this historic moment with Billy Taylor while we can. Billy is now 86 and still plays marvelously – now is the time to collaborate!"

The first half of the program will feature the VocalEssence Chorus and Ensemble Singers performing music inspired by the life and vision of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., including works by Stephen Michael Newby, Cary John Franklin, Wilson Simonal, Alice Parker, Moses Hogan and Uzee Brown, as well as rock band U2's "MLK" as arranged by Bob Chilcott.

Each year since 1991, Philip Brunelle and VocalEssence have spotlighted the music of African American composers and performers in the VocalEssence **WITNESS** concert. Since 2005, Ordway Center for the Performing Arts has partnered with VocalEssence to present **WITNESS**.




# **TCAGO Student Organ Competition** By Mary Newton

# Update on PipeWorks event held on November 8, 2008

St. Paul's United Church of Christ and Twin Cities AGO sponsored the event complete with pancake breakfast and pizza. This was our first time to introduce the newly revised Bach and Messiaen lessons and science experiments illustrating how the organ works.

We had an intergeneration group on interested participants – some had played the organ for a few years, one had just started lessons, others just curious. Ages ranged from second grade to retirement. We did have a "bonding moment" when one of the seniors played a transcription of a piano concerto on the organ that she was learning and one of the young people was surprised to find out he was working to learn the same piece of music. Also, one of the support people from the church helped us contain surprise technical problems and decided to stick around for the program. A retired 3M scientist has offered to help with adding to the science experiments.

Thanks to the TCAGO volunteers who helped make this happen – Tim Patterson and Lawrence Lawyer who transported "mini opus" (our demonstration instrument) to the site and back; Geoff Olson and Karen Becker who taught the Bach Lesson; Priscilla Franken who taught both the introduction to the organ and the Messiaen lessons; Phil Asgian who taught the science experiments; Rita Docter of the BRAVO program who contributed greatly to the Bach and Messiaen lessons and other curriculum; Westminster volunteer Barb Mauk who helped provide directions, set up and clean up and several great St. Paul's UCC staff who helped make it all happen, especially pastor Norma Rae Hunt.

We have received several connections recently to other possible venues and will continue working to bring the organ to audiences of all ages. See a separate article in this edition on the Pipe Organ Discovery Day on Feb. 21, 2009. ₽


