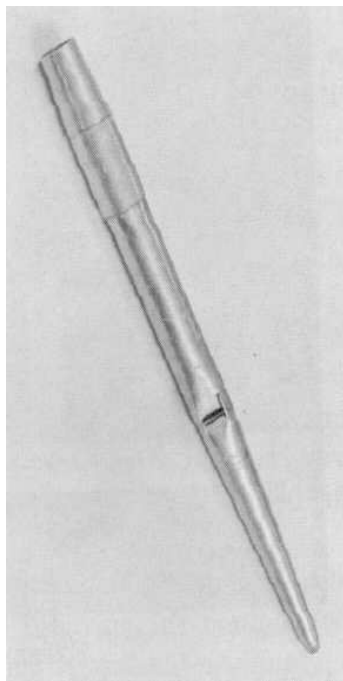

Summer Noontime Organ Recital Series continues in Mankato

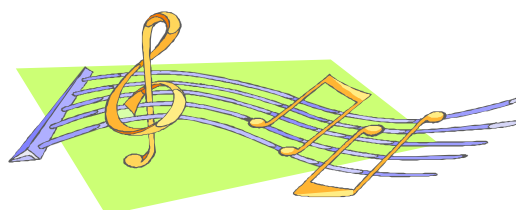

Mount Olive Music and Fine Arts presents two public events in association with its Third Annual “Bach Täge” or “Bach day.” During a two-day convocation, participants will study and prepare two cantatas, *Meine Seel' erhebt den Herrn* (BWV10) and *Wer nur den lieben Gott lässt walten* (BWV93), both of which will be performed in the context of a service of Evening Prayer on Sunday evening. And on the prior Saturday evening, Mount Olive's cantor David Cherwien, with soprano Susan Palo Cherwien and guest cellist Daniel McIntosh will offer a brief concert of Bach works.

Kathy Romney returns to conduct Bach Täge for a third year in 2009. Kathy is Director of Choral Activities at the University of Minnesota and Artistic Director of the Minnesota Chorale, the principal chorus of the Minnesota Orchestra. She has been a chorus master to the Internationale Bachakademie Stuttgart, and was named 2002 Conductor of the Year by the Minnesota Chapter of the American Choral Directors Association.

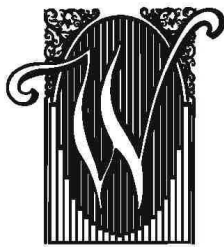
