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Letter to the TCAGO

Last September, I was struggling with terrible tension and pain in my neck and back. A friend of mine told me about John Sheehan, a Certified Massage Therapist who he sees for similar physical problems.

I was thrilled with the results because I felt tremendously better. It's truly amazing what John can do for us organists,

The first half of the WITNESS concert will feature Sweet Honey In The Rock performing some of their signature a cappella arrangements, followed by the 100-voice VocalEssence Chorus singing "Truth Pressed to Earth Shall Rise" by Sweet Honey's own Ysaye Barnwell, "Folks, I'm Telling You" by Twin Cities composer Elizabeth Alexander, and "Give Me Your Hand" by John Work III.

The second half of the concert, created by Ysaye Barnwell and Philip Brunelle, will incorporate the theme of activism in labor, civil rights and peace. The groups will sing union songs such as "Step By Step," "More than a Paycheck," and Philip Brunelle's arrangement of "Solidarity Forever." The ensembles will perform a civil rights medley culminating in Rosephanye Powell's "I Dream A World."

Representing the theme of peace, the VocalEssence Chorus will sing a setting of Dag Hammarskjöld's words, "Thou Who Art Over Us," and Sweet Honey will present "Let There Be Peace" and "Study War No More." The finale (involving the audience) will be a setting of "This Little Light of Mine."

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BEETHOVEN AND BACH

On **Sunday**, **February 28**th at **3:00 pm**, the *Music at Wayzata Concert Series* presents Beethoven's *Mass in C Major* and the *Bach Double Harpsichord Concerto in C minor*. The Wayzata Community Church Chancel Choir and the Wayzata Symphony Orchestra under the direction of Thomas



Paulson, will perform the Beethoven Mass. Written in 1807, this was Beethoven's first mass setting. It is a masterpiece of sacred music which is not often performed attributed to the overshadowing by his towering *Missa solemnis*.

Steve Gentile and Diana Lee Lucker, together with the Wayzata Symphony will perform the Bach Harpsichord Concerto for two harpsichords, BWV 1060. This concerto is based on one of Bach's earliest concertos: the *Concerto for Violin and Oboe in C minor* BWV 1060R and dates from the 1730s.

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TCAGO Archive News "Added Inventory"

In September, I received what amounted to a large, full box of items from Bill Stump. As the general chairman of the 2008 National AGO Convention, Bill had detailed records:

- AGO National policies
- Budget summaries (break-even and optimistic)
- Committee information and reports
- Composer commissions
- Correspondence
- · Daily schedules
- Evaluation forms and results
- Minutes of various committees
- Steering Committee minutes, final reports and wrap up

After inventorying the box, I delivered it to the Minnesota History Center in early December. That's the permanent home for most of our Archives. I say "most" because they're fussy about what Minnesota interest is and what national interest is. In mid-December, a courier delivered to my address a half-empty box of what the History Center didn't want of the '08 convention. I'll check with the TCAGO Board about what to keep, but may be delivering the remainder to Westminster Presbyterian Church where our "floating" collection resides.

In December, I met with Duane Swanson—curator of manuscripts at the History Center—and asked when our archives delivered from 2003—2009 would be inventoried and cataloged. (I've been asking that question for five years.) Cataloging is pending but he gave me a copy of what the cataloged additions will be and how it will look online. There's an increase of two more boxes. The 2008 AGO Convention program brochure has been cataloged as a book.

It's encouraging to know that soon we'll be able to see the additions online. Here's the current URL: http://www.mnhs.org/library/findaids/00017.xml. \$\mathcal{F}\$





VocalEssence explores lesser-known music of Copland

Considered one of the most respected American composers of all time, most listeners know little of Aaron Copland's music beyond "Appalachian Spring" and "Fanfare for the Common Man." Under the direction of Philip Brunelle, the VocalEssence Chorus & Ensemble Singers, joined by special guests, the James Sewell Ballet and Eastview High School Concert Choir, will explore some of Copland's lesser-known works in a performance titled **Undiscovered Copland** on **Saturday, March 13, 2010 (8 pm)** at Ted Mann Concert Hall in Minneapolis. Classical Minnesota Public Radio's John Birge will host a Pre-Concert Conversation at 7 pm with guest artist James Sewell.

Tickets for **Undiscovered Copland** are \$20-\$40 (Service charges apply. Student tickets are half-price and group discounts are available.) For tickets and information, call 612-371-5656 or visit www.vocalessence.org.

Premiered in 1937 and rarely performed, the story of Copland's "play-opera" *The Second Hurricane* remains timeless today. A group of high school students volunteer to help with relief efforts in the aftermath of a devastating hurricane. They are dropped off with a cache of supplies in the midst of a flooded area even as a second hurricane is forming. As the unexpected storm strikes and the water rises, the young peoples' courage is tested. The Eastview High School Concert Choir of Apple Valley will join the VocalEssence Ensemble Singers for a semi-staged version of the opera, directed by Jon Cranney.

Following intermission, the James Sewell Ballet will perform original choreography to Copland's *In the Beginning*, accompanied by VocalEssence and mezzo soprano soloist Adriana Zabala. *In the Beginning* was performed on the inaugural 1969-1970 season of VocalEssence (then known as the Plymouth Music Series) with composer Aaron Copland conducting.

Original choreography will also accompany the beloved melodies of Copland's *Old American Songs*, including the familiar favorites "Simple Gifts" and "Shall We Gather at The River."

The performance will culminate with the artistic forces — the VocalEssence and Eastview High School Choruses, James Sewell Ballet, and orchestra — joining together to perform Copland's triumphant "The Promise of Living" from the 1952 opera *The Tender Land.* \$\mathcal{I}\$
