# **TCAGO April Competition Winners**

Five organists competed in the TCAGO competition on Saturday, April 17 at Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Minneapolis.

The first place winner was Daniel O'Connor from Lawrence University in Appleton, Wisconsin. Daniel is a sophomore at the Conservatory of Music at Lawrence University, studying organ with Kathrine Handford. Currently in his sixth year of organ study, Daniel previously studied with Thomas F. Froehlich in Dallas. Texas.

Last summer, Daniel received

first place in the AGO's Regional Competition for Young Organists, Region VII, held in Albuquerque, New Mexico. This summer, he, along with eight other regional winners from across the country, will perform in the "Rising Stars" recital at the AGO national convention in Washington, D.C.. Daniel is currently pursuing degrees in Organ Performance and Economics at Lawrence.

The second place winner was Susanna Valleau from Lawrence University in Appleton, Wisconsin. Susanna Valleau, a native of Andover, Massachusetts, is a senior organ performance major and math minor at Lawrence University. She began organ lessons at age 17 with Barbara Bruns. Susanna entered Lawrence unsure of what role she wanted organ to play in her life, but as she continued her studies, she fell in love with it. Wanting to know more about the mechanics behind the instrument, last summer Susanna interned at C.B. Fisk Organ Builders in Gloucester, Massachusetts where she spent time working in the wood shop, pipe shop, and on the road voicing. This past fall, Susanna traveled to Amsterdam to study with Jacques van Oortmerssen. While abroad, she had the opportunity to play and study on historical organs throughout the Netherlands. Next year, Susanna will begin her master's degree


## **Dean's Column**


