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Dean's Column

There has been a lot of lead up to the new way of renewing our memberships for the next year -National taking charge, the use of on-line payment systems, etc. Well, it turns out National is not ready to do this. So we will have to wait for the following year to use this new system.

Not to worry, the old system is still in place! I would like to reit-

erate my challenge from last month's Dean's Column: All of us need to encourage our colleagues to renew and also to recruit new members.

In my opening remarks at the first board meeting of the year I indicated that one of my goals as Dean was to encourage reaching out to other organizations so as to enlarge the number of people who are aware of TCAGO and its work and to find innovative ways of enhancing the benefits to the members of each organization. This has involved TCAGO's reaching out to cooperate with other professional music and arts organizations. I also mentioned the possibility of reaching out to socially conscious or humanitarian non-profit organizations.

We church musicians can live in a fairly insular world. Conflict with a pastor, problems with the instruments, only one soprano in the choir on Sunday, not being paid enough, etc., etc., all of which is terribly important because we want to maintain a high quality of music making at our worship services so we can fully assist the praying public in their transformative relationship with their creator. On the other hand, perhaps we should try to view our life through a wider lens and find ways to contribute to society by assisting those who are less fortunate than we.

Way back in March, we had the 'Before Bach's Birthday' Bash. It was a remarkably successful day-long five concert festival involving five churches along St. Paul's Summit Avenue. Michael Barone was the lead organizer for this event. Its success was both artistic and as a builder of an audience of the general public for the music of Bach, Reger, and the organ itself. There was a box at each venue in which the audience could donate to the Habitat for Humanity. One thousand fifty-nine dollars were raised! All should be thanked for their generosity.

I hope TCAGO will continue to engage with other professional organizations such as NPM, ACDA, MMTA, etc. If you have any ideas about how we can undertake these relationships, please contact me, or anyone on the Publicity Committee to explain your ideas.

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





Dr. Luckner served as head of the Conference of Roman Catholic Cathedral Musicians (United States and Canada) from 1997 to 2002. Prior to his appointment in La Crosse, he was the Assistant in Liturgical Music at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C. Earlier church positions include serving as organist and music director at the Church of the Guardian Angels (Roman Catholic) and at Holy Trinity Episcopal Church in Cincinnati, and at Christ Episcopal Church in Oberlin, Ohio. He previously held assistant organist positions at St. John the Baptist Catholic Church in Canton, Ohio, and at St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Massillon, Ohio,

He holds the Doctor of Musical Arts degree and the Master of Music degree from the College-Conservatory of Music at the University of Cincinnati, and the Bachelor of Music degree from the Oberlin College Conservatory of Music. He participated in the "Accelerated Bachelor of Music Program for High School Students" at the Cleveland Institute of Music. His organ teachers include Roberta Gary, Garth Peacock, Margaret Irwin-Brandon, and Philip Hodel; he studied harpsichord with William Porter and Lisa Crawford. He has performed in master classes under David Craighead, Luigi Ferdinando Tagliavini and Louis Robilliard. His choral conducting studies were with Daniel Moe.

Awards include election to the national honorary music society Pi Kappa Lambda, the Selby Houston Memorial Award in Organ and Theory at Oberlin, and the University of Cincinnati Organ Playing Competition: Strader Awards (first place in 1981, second place in 1983). He is listed in Who's Who in America (2006-) and Who's Who in the World (2007-).

VocalEssence ¡Cantaré! By Laura Holst

Over 400 Twin Cities area students and community members will join the VocalEssence Chorus & Ensemble Singers to perform the world premieres of music composed specifically for them by two Mexican composers taking part in the **VocalEssence ¡Cantaré! Program**. This year-long program culminates on **Tuesday**, **May 24th** with the **VocalEssence ¡Cantaré! Community Concert** at Ordway Center for the Performing Arts. The performance at **7:00 PM** is free and open to the public, but tickets are required. Free tickets are available at the following locations: Ordway Center box office, Consulate of Mexico, Latino Communications Network office and Neighborhood House at Wellstone Center.

The **VocalEssence ¡Cantaré!** program links Mexican composers with students and adults in our community through residencies in schools and choral organizations. This cross-



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cultural program creates a deeper understanding of the rich Mexican classical musical heritage, develops a new understanding of the traditions that are melding Mexican and American cultures, and creates a new body of Spanish language music for voices and instruments that will be shared with the community. The participating singers are from Como Park High School, Mound Westonka High School, South High School, Adams Spanish Immersion School, Ramsey International Fine Arts Center, Latino Children's Choir and the VocalEssence Chorus & Ensemble Singers.

Composers Horacio Uribe and Lilia Vázquez first visited the Twin Cities in September 2010 to meet their respective ensembles. After one week together, the composers returned to Mexico to begin composing new works, which were delivered to the singers in December. During their second visit to Minnesota in March, the composers rehearsed their new compositions with their ensembles. Finally, this year-long educational program culminates when the composers return for a third and final time in May for the world premieres of their compositions at the VocalEssence ¡Cantaré! Community Concert.

Horacio Uribe, born in Mexico, was educated at the Tchaikovsky State Conservatory in Moscow, Russia, graduating in 1995 with a Master's degree in composition. As a composer, Uribe has a catalog of over forty pieces for solo instruments as well as chamber and orchestral works. Professor Uribe is currently a researcher at the Universidad Michoacana de San Nicolás de Hidalgo (UMSNH) in Morelia, Michoacan; a Preparatory Coordinator of music at the Popular School of Fine Arts in UMSNH, where he has taught harmony, counterpoint, orchestration, analysis and composition; and an academic instructor at the Conservatorio de las Rosas, AC.

Lilia Vázquez studied composition in Europe obtaining degrees in Music Theory and Composition in Germany. After moving back to Mexico, Vázquez won first prize in the Mexico National Contest Sor Juana Inés de la Cruz with the work entitled *To Christ the Blessed Sacrament, Communion Day.* Her works include orchestral, choral, chamber, and piano repertoire, and have been performed in major festivals in France, Germany, the United States, Italy, Cuba and Mexico.


