at the University of Kansas. He earned a Bachelor of Music degree in organ from St. Olaf College, Master of Music degree from Northwestern University, and Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the Eastman School of Music. He has studied with Edmund Ladouceur, Robert Kendall, Karel Paukert, David Craighead, and Catharine Crozier. He has also studied in France with Marie-Claire Alain.

Recent European concert tours include recitals at Notre Dame Cathedral, La Madeleine and Saint-Étienne-du-Mont in Paris, St. Stephen's Cathedral in Vienna, Chartres Cathedral and concerts and master classes in Germany, Prague and Poland and Russia.

Significant American recitals include appearances at four regional conventions of The American Guild of Organists. The University of Kansas presented him with a W.T. Kemper Fellowship for Teaching Excellence at the beginning of the 1997-1998 academic year. He was the first University of Kansas professor from the arts to be recognized with this prestigious award. He has had six students win Fulbright Awards and two students awarded International Rotary Grants during his tenure at the University of Kansas.

The VocalEssence Chorus and Ensemble Singers perform their annual *Welcome Christmas* concerts with a special focus on French Christmas carols. Philip Brunelle will conduct.

The 32-voice Ensemble Singers will be performing favorites such as *O Holy Night, Carol of the Birds, Angels We Have Heard on High* and *Bring a Torch, Jeannette, Isabella* in their original French.

Every year since 1998, VocalEssence and American Composers Forum have co-sponsored a contest for composers to write new Christmas carols. This year's contest called for a carol for men's voices accompanied by English horn. The winning carols, by James Kallembach (Chicago, Illinois) and Robert Sieving (St. Paul, Minnesota), will be premiered at *Welcome Christmas*.

A highlight of the concert will be the performance of the classic Christmas cantata *So Hallow'd is the Time* by Stephen Paulus. Scored for mixed chorus with string orchestra, it will feature boy soprano, soprano, tenor and baritone soloists. The texts are drawn from English poets of the 17th and 18th centuries, including William Shakespeare, John Donne, Robert Southwell and John Milton.

TCAGO through the Decades - 1960s, Part III

1964-65 Season, continued

On February 19, we met at St. Paul's United Church of Christ. Ruth Rye, director of music, was our hostess for a panel discussion on "Liturgical Changes in the Roman Catholic Church." George Carthage, Father Gerard Farrell OSB, Richard Proulx, Father Richard Schuler and Father John Sweeney served as members of the panel.

We were at Gloria Dei Lutheran Church in St. Paul on March 13. It was a joint meeting with TCCA (Twin Cities Choirmasters Association). Lillian Sandberg, organist at Gloria Dei, was our hostess. The Gloria Dei Church Choir sang under the direction of Dr. Frank Bencriscutto – University of Minnesota – with Mrs. Sandberg at the console of the new Möller Organ.

Skinner Memorial Chapel, Carleton College, was the setting for the April 4 meeting. Our hosts were Dr. and Mrs. Henry Woodward. The meal was \$1.75. The program was a concert of contemporary choral music by the 135-voice college choir and an organ recital by Dr. David Johnson featuring contemporary organ compositions for the church service.

The April 1965 *Pipenotes* includes an AGO Scholarship Competition application blank for ages 17-22.

The student recital program was held at Joyce Methodist Church, Minneapolis on May 23, 1965.

On Sunday, May 9, we met at St. Clement's Episcopal Church, St. Paul, for our annual Guild Service. A Choral Evensong was sung by the parish choir of adults and boys featuring William Byrd's *Second Service in B minor*. Officers of the TCAGO participated by reading portions of the service. The rector of St. Clement's, George Carlton Stierwald, gave the address.

1965-66 Season

The Twin Motors Motel, 1975 University Ave. in St. Paul, was the setting for our opening dinner meeting on September 28, 1965. Leonard Sipe, director of the St. Paul Philharmonic Society [forerunner of the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra], was our guest speaker.

On October 23, we met at the Mastertone Recording Company at East 4th St., in St. Paul. *Pipenotes* describes the meeting as a "...recorded journey through several centuries of organ building and composition. Specifications of the instruments to be heard will be furnished."

We weren't in St. Paul for our November 12 meeting. We combined with Twin City Choirmasters Association and met at Mt. Olivet Lutheran Church in Minneapolis. Our hostesses were Edith B. Norberg and Diana Lee Metzker. "Mrs. Norberg will give a youth choir demonstration and will conduct the senior choir in a program of liturgical choral music. Mrs. Metzker will be heard in an organ recital on the three manual Möller organ." One of the pieces Diana Lee played was the *Passacaglia and Fugue in C minor* by J.S. Bach.

[There was not a December meeting but there was news about the passing of Mansfield Johnson, longtime AGO member who died at age 44 while giving a music lesson on December 21, 1965. He was our *Pipenotes* editor in 1957-58]

Our first meeting in the new year of 1966 was on January 29 at Unity Unitarian Church in St. Paul. Dinner (\$1.75) was at 6:15 and the program was at 8:00. We heard Virginia Weatherbee Powell, AAGO, play the new three-manual Noack mechanical action organ.

We met on February 18, 1966 at Westminster Presbyterian Church in Minneapolis. For the same price of \$1.75 we had dinner followed by a "console party" lead by host, Dr. Edward Berryman. The dis-

cussion concerned hymns, registration, organ literature, etc.

A heading in the February 1966 *Pipenotes* reads: "3 Newsworthy Arrivals."

- 1. Macalester College Aeolian-Skinner organ in the Janet Wallace Fine Arts Center
- 2. Mt. Olive Lutheran Schlicker organ [Paul Manz, organist]
- 3. Casavant organ at Bethlehem Lutheran in Minneapolis [Kathryn Moen, organist]

Also in the February issue, on page 6, Kathryn U. Moen wrote a letter of welcome to Richard D. Waggoner, the new organist at Hennepin Ave. Methodist Church in Minneapolis.

On March 5, we had a joint meeting with TCCA (Twin City Choirmasters Assoc.) at First Congregational Church in southeast Minneapolis. Our hostess was Patricia Porter, FAGO and the topic was "Unusual music for small church choirs and organ." (Again, the dinner cost was \$1.75.)

After the March issue, there's a gap in *Pipenotes* at the Minnesota History Center. April, May, June, September, October and November are missing. Merrill Davis was no longer the editor in the fall of 1966. Earl Eyrich who taught harpsichord at the U. of M. and was the organist at St. John's Lutheran and later at Gethsemane Episcopal Church on Fourth Ave. in Minneapolis, became the *Pipenotes* editor. But he was the editor for a very brief time. Our dean, Kathryn Moen, took over in February of 1967. Speaking of brief: Paul Manz, elected as Dean in September of 1966, sent a letter of resignation in November. Kathryn U. Moen (former Sub-Dean) became the Dean.

1966-67 Season

On February 11, 1967 we met at Janet Wallace Fine Arts Center, Macalester College. It was emphasized as not being a dinner meeting.

Ian Morton, chairman of the department of music, opened the program with demonstrations of electronic music. Professor Morton had recently produced *The Conversion of St. Paul*, a work calling for soloists, choral ensemble and 'electronic brain.'

Edward Berryman, instructor in organ at Macalester and organist/choirmaster at Westminster Presbyterian Church in Minneapolis, played a recital on the Aeolian-Skinner organ recently installed in the Concert Hall.

No meeting in March 1967.

We heard French organist André Marchal on April 14, 1967. The Parisian organist played works by Clerambault, Bach, Franck and Tournemire at Westwood Lutheran Church in St. Louis Park.

The May 12, 1967 a Guild Service was held at Gethsemane Episcopal Church in Minneapolis. Earl Eyrich, organist/choir master, was the host.

In *Pipenotes*, "News of Guild Members," for March of 1967; Gerald Bales' name appears. He was the organist/choirmaster at St. Mark's Cathedral in Minneapolis.

"Although he is making satisfactory progress, at this writing, Gerald Bales remains hospitalized at Abbott Hospital and is forbidden visitors or telephone calls. The intruder who attacked him in deserted St. Mark's Cathedral on Saturday night, February 18, 1967 injured Mr. Bales severely with brass knuckles and the blunt edge of an ax. The dean has written to Mr. and Mrs. Bales expressing the outrage, sympathy, and best wishes of the Guild. Marlene Baver is substituting for Mr. Bales at St. Mark's."
