

As part of our inaugural year of the St. John's Institute for Sacred Music, St. John's University and the Basilica are co-hosting a program of great 20th century French sacred music in the landmark Basilica of St. Mary, designed by French architect, Emmanuel Masqueray. Most of the works are based on Gregorian Chant and all are for feast or holy days of the liturgical year.

The program features the St. John's Men's Chorus, Axel Theimer, director; St. John's Gregorian Chant Schola, Fr. Anthony Ruff OSB, director; and five organists: Dr. K.R. Kasling, Christopher Stroh,

Br. Theophane Windschitl OSB, Rebecca Visser, Audrey Seah. All are connected to St. John's as faculty, recent graduates or advanced graduate students.



The program will feature, *Messe cum Jubilo* by Maurice Duruflé, "Pentecost" from *L'Orgue Mystique* by Charles Tournemire, *L'Ascension* by Olivier Messiaen, *Embrace of Fire* and *Pange Lingua* (variations) by Naji Hakim.

Selected chant interpolations will be sung and program notes will outline details of the genesis and style of these wonderfully colorful works performed in a visual and acoustical environment for which they were originally conceived.

During its extensive renovation in 2008, the Basilica organ was enlarged and several voices appro-

priate for French repertoire were added. Please join us for this Grand and unique event!

Craig Cramer Organ Recital – April 28

Saturday, April 28, 2012, 7:00 p.m. freewill offering. St. Olaf Catholic Church, 215 S. 8th Street, downtown Minneapolis. Free parking in the Energy Ramp at 3rd Ave. & 9th St.

Craig Cramer is Professor of Organ and Artist in Residence at the University of Notre Dame in Indiana. He also serves as organist at St. David of Wales Episcopal Church in Elkhart, Indiana. He holds degrees from Westminster Choir College and the

Eastman School of Music where he earned the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Organ Performance. The Eastman School also awarded him the prestigious Performer's Certificate in Organ. He has studied with Russell Saunders, William Hays, James Drake, David Boe, and André Marchal (Paris).



At St. Olaf, on the 2001 67-rank Lively-Fulcher organ, Dr. Cramer will perform an eclectic program including music by J.S. Bach, the monumental set of variations by Auguste Fauchard, *Le Mystère de Noël*, and *Introduction, Scherzo, and Fugue on B-E-A-T-E* by Toni Zahnbrecher of Munich, Germany.

One of the most traveled organists of his generation, Cramer maintains an active recital career across the country and in Europe. He has performed in forty-four of the US states as well as in Canada. Regularly invited to play some of the most important historic organs in the world, Cramer's European concerts have included performances in Germany on the 1727 König organ in Steinfeld, the 1748 Gottfried Silbermann in Nassau, and Schnitger organs in Norden and Steinkirchen. In the Netherlands he has performed on the 1725 Hagerbeer/Schnitger in Alkmaar, the 1727 Müller in Leeuwarden, the 1643/1814 Bader/Timpe organ in Zutphen, the 1696 Schnitger organ in Noordbroek, the 1770 Hinsz organ in Midwolda, the 1756 Van Deventer organ in Nijkerk, the 1756 Müller organ in Beverwijk, the 1768 Bätz organ in Woerden and the 1726 Vater organ in the Oude Kerk in Amsterdam. He recently performed in Denmark on the Compenius and Marcusson organs in the Frederiksborg Slotskirke in Hilleröd and the Lorentz/Marcusson organ in Roskilde Cathedral. In Sweden he performed in Buxtehude's church Sancta Maria in Helsingborg and on the new (2000) North German Organ built by GoArt in the style of Schnitger in the Örgryte nya kyrka in Göteborg. He has also performed in Austria, France, Switzerland and Poland.

Cramer has performed for conventions of the American Guild of Organists and ALCM, as well as for many AGO Chapters across the country. He has also appeared as a soloist with a number of different orchestras. Cramer performed the complete organ works of Bach during a series of eighteen concerts using a distinguished set of mechanical-action organs in the state of Indiana.

Dr. Cramer was instrumental in the installation of a new organ hall and organ built by Paul Fritts on the campus of the University of Notre Dame, which he dedicated in January of 2005 by performing a series of ten different recital programs. This organ was the focal point of an AGO National Pedagogy Conference on the subject of Buxtehude given in September 2005. In honor of the 300th anniversary of the death of Dieterich Buxtehude in 2007, Dr. Cramer presented his complete organ works in a series of nine concerts on this organ. The University of Notre Dame recently recognized Cramer with a Kaneb distinguished faculty award. He was a featured performer at the 2008 EROI Festival in Rochester, New York.

1970s, Part I

Thanks to Stephen Rosenberg for catching my omission in the Dec./Jan. Archive News. Yes, Peter Le Huray's entire career had been based in Cambridge, around St Catharine's College. It should've been acknowledged. This is what I focused on from the Mar. 6, 1969 Pipenotes: ..." and directed the King's College Chapel Choir during the 1967-68 sabbatical leave of Mr. David Wilcox, the choir's director."

We begin the 1970s with the January 10 meeting which featured the Augsburg College Choir and it

which featured the Augsburg College Choir and its director, Leland Sateren.

- Cafeteria supper in the Augsburg College Center at 6:30.
- Workshop featuring recent church music within reach of parish choirs with the Augsburg Choir demonstrating much of the music.
- Dr. Sateren speaking on contemporary compositional devices in new choral music.

On February 3, at 6:30, we ate at Lee's Village Inn, St. Paul. The program – featuring folk rock musician John Ylvisaker – began at 8:00 p.m., Gloria Dei Lutheran Church, So. Snelling, St. Paul.

- "John will discuss multi-media art forms using film, music and lights simultaneously to convey a Christian message."
- He also discussed issues in church music
- "Ylvisaker feels pop music and art forms are in the church to stay."

We met at Mt. Olive Lutheran Church, Minneapolis on March 10, 1970. Paul Manz demonstrated and discussed new music for the organ. He played a wide variety of pieces suitable for introducing a hymn.

Classes in service playing were taught by Earl Barr and Lawrence Martin on April 7, 14, 21, 28.

May 17 was the date for our annual meeting and Guild Festival Service held at Plymouth Congregational Church. TCCA (Twin Cities Choirmasters) were our guests.

1970-71 Season

Our opening meeting of the season was on Sunday, September 20, 1970. We met at Peoples United Church of Christ, Snelling Ave., So. in St. Paul. Dr. John Wright Harvey, Associate Professor of Music at the Univ. of Wisconsin, Madison, brought sound recordings and color slides of European cathedrals to share and discuss.

We met at University Lutheran Church of Hope on October 19. Nancy Lancaster played M. Dupre's *Prelude and Fugue in B*, J.S. Bach's *Prelude and Fugue in Eb*, et al. "A business meeting will follow."

Organist Marilyn Keiser played at the St. Paul Cathedral on November 17, 1970. Her program included the M. Durufle *Chorale and Variations on Veni Creator*, O. Messiaen's *Messa de la Pentecôte*, two set-

tings – Johannes Brahms and Alan Stout – of *O Sacred Head*, and *Prelude* by Richard Stewart for tape and organ. Following the concert, we hosted a reception at a nearby Holiday Inn.

Pipenotes denotes another organ recital that took place in November. It was on November 2 at Westminster Presbyterian Church and Pierre Cochereau, French organist, was the performer. "In an extraordinary gesture, the church used its \$25,000 closed circuit TV to give every member of the audience a close-in, compelling view of the manuals."

TCAGO sponsored a Festival Choral Service at Central Lutheran on the First Sunday in Advent, November 29, 1970. Adult, high school and children's choirs of Guild members were invited to participate. Frederic Hilary and Richard Waggoner were the conductors and Joyce Hilary was the organist. Rehearsal was at 5:00 p.m., supper at 6:00, organ recital at 7:15 and worship service at 7:30.

Our first meeting in 1971 was on January 19. It was a dinner meeting at Hennepin Avenue Methodist Church. There was a discussion of possibilities for our local chapter together with national programs. Larry Martin wrote an article in *Music* magazine [now *TAO*] for October, 1970; "The Guild: A Blueprint for the Early '70s." That also was discussed at the meeting.

On Monday, February 15, we heard a concert/demonstration given by the Carillon Choristers, the city-wide children's choir led by Edith Byquist Norberg. The meeting was held at Conn Auditorium, Plymouth Congregational Church.

We were at Mt. Olive Lutheran Church, Minneapolis, on March 15. Paul Manz, organist, presented a lecture/demonstration on Lenten hymn preludes.

We met at the home of organ builder John Van Daalen on Tuesday, April 27. He was finishing a tracker-action organ and spoke to us about modern organ tone and construction.

The annual Guild Service and Installation of Officers took place on Sunday, May 9, 1971 at the Carleton College Fine Arts Center (dedicated in the Fall of 1970) Northfield, MN. There was a recital at 5:00 p.m. played by Robert Thompson, organ instructor at St. Olaf College. We ate supper at 6:00 in the Carleton Tea Room and attended the Guild Service at 7:15. Mrs. Enid Woodward, music professor at Carleton, played for the service.


