Three talented organists competed in the TCAGO Student Competition on Sat. April 21, at Bethlehem Lutheran Church.

The first place winner was Alexis VanZalen from Holland, MI. Alexis is a senior at Lawrence University in Appleton, WI where she studies with Kathrine Handford. She is pursuing both a B.M.

degree in organ performance and a B.A. in history. Alexis began studying the organ by taking secondary lessons at Interlochen Arts Camp during the summer of 2006, and over the course of the summer she decided to begin focusing on organ

rather than piano once she returned home. More recently, in 2011 she received second prize in the Wisconsin National Federation of Music Club's Student/Collegiate Competition as well as second place in the American Guild of Organists' 2011 Regional Competition for Young Organists held in Wichita, KS. She also completed two internships at the Smithsonian Institution in Washington, DC during the summers of 2010 and 2011. This coming

The second place winner was Karl Robson. Karl is a senior Church Music and Organ Performance major at St. Olaf College, where he studies with Dr. Catherine Rodland. He serves as Staff Organist at Cross View Lutheran Church, Edina, MN, playing its Holtkamp instrument (1993, II/28).

He began his organ career at age 11. A three-time recipient of the organ studies scholarship awarded by the Southeast Minnesota Chapter of the American Guild of Organists, he previously studied with Lee Afdahl of First Presbyterian Church, Rochester and Dr. Dean Billmeyer of the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities.

At St. Olaf, Karl serves as a weekly organist for daily chapel services, works as a music theory and aural skills teaching assistant, and sings in the St. Olaf Choir. He was honored to accompany the choir as organist on its 2011 domestic tour. This summer, he will serve as Worship Assistant at the Lutheran Summer Music Academy and Festival. This fall, he will begin graduate studies at the Eastman School of Music, studying with David Higgs.

The first prize of \$2,000 was sponsored by the Schubert Club of St. Paul and the second prize of \$1000 was sponsored by TCAGO member Phil Asgian. Judges for the competition were Allan Mahnke, Laura Edman and Kris Langlois.

Craig Carnahan wins Composition Competition

Craig Carnahan of St. Louis Park, Minn has won the prize of \$1000 in the 2012 Twin Cities American



Guild of Organists Composition Competition for his setting of *Psalm 130: Out of the Depths*, scored for SATB choir and pipe organ. Twenty-five compositions were submitted from across the United States and were judged anonymously by Robert Strusinski, Curt

Oliver, Lawrence Lawyer and Dr. James Callahan, ex officio.

Carnahan received his B.A. from Concordia College (Moorhead, MN) and did graduate studies in composition with Dominick Argento and Paul Fetler at the University of Minnesota. In 1993 he received a McKnight Composition Fellowship to collaborate with the acclaimed poet, playwright and filmmaker James Broughton on a setting of his libretto, *The Last Word.* In 1998 he was composer-in-residence for the American Composers Forum's Faith Partners Residency Project. In 2008 he received an Artist Initiative Grant from the Minnesota State Arts Board to compose a string quartet and a woodwind quintet. His music has been described as "absorbing, richly textured and emotionally stirring" (Minneapolis Star Tribune).

In the past twenty-five years, Craig Carnahan has received over fifty commissions for original compositions. His music has been heard in performances by the Dale Warland Singers (St. Paul, MN), Conspirare (Austin, TX), the Los Angeles Master Chorale (Los Angeles, CA), Kantorei and St. Martin's Chamber Choir (Denver, CO), Joseph Johnson (principal cellist of the Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra) and Milwaukee Choral Artists (Milwaukee, WI), Minnesota Boychoir (St. Paul, MN), Centennial Children's Chorus (Fort Collins, CO), Sound Circle (Boulder, CO), and over thirty of the GALA choruses in North America.

Recent commissions and premieres include A Quiet Place for Minneapolis pianist Timothy De Prey, Sappho's Raft for Kantorei, If in Your Heart for Choral Arts Ensemble (Rochester, MN), and I am Into Your Fire for Sound Circle.

I need your help. I need to have you go to the site and take an editing look at the institutions you know about...or know a little. Send me anything I don't have! I don't mind criticism if it includes new information. I'm not offended by corrections.

- The things I need are:
- 1. Name and address of the church including zip code.
- 2. The builder and the information on the organ manuals, stops, ranks, pipes and any other information you have.
- 3. I need the dates of the organ and its predecessors. You don't have to try to put it into the format I use. Just tell me in plain English and I'll do my best to follow my rules. I use the OHS rule of thumb, "whoever changed it last is the builder. Whoever built it before that should be mentioned with dates."
- 4. If you have the stoplists of the older organs or versions, let me have them.
- 5. Photos: I'd like photos of the exterior of the church, the altar or stage, pipe display, if any, and the console minus the kleenex box, last Sunday's bulletin and your organ shoes. Send them in an email if you can. If you can't, mail the pictures to me, I'll scan them and promise, promise, promise I'll send them back.
- 6. Electronic organs are organs. I use a bit different format but they belong here too.

Upper Midwest Conference on Worship, Music and Homiletics

TCAGO member Dr. Lynn Trapp, Director of Worship & Music/Organist at St. Olaf Church in downtown Minneapolis and Deacon Thomas Winninger inaugurate a Christian, interdenominational Upper Midwest Conference on Worship, Music and Homiletics for church musicians, clergy and artists of liturgical environment. The 2012 conference will take place on Friday, September 28 and Saturday, September 29 at St. Olaf Church. Registrants will participate in theological and musical sessions which challenge perspective and build technique as pastoral ministers.

Dr. Lynn Trapp is a concert organist, conductor, composer, liturgist and clinician. His organ/choral music is held by several major publishers Since 1996 he has served as Director of Worship/Music, Organist/Pianist at St. Olaf Catholic Church, downtown Minneapolis where he directs an extensive liturgical program including radio/television broadcasts and concert series. He holds degrees from Southern Illinois University, University of Notre Dame, and after beginning doctoral work at the Eastman School of Music, completed the Doctor of Musical Arts degree at the University of Kansas. Dr. Trapp directed the 2001 design and installation of the Lively-Fulcher pipe organ at St. Olaf and is a workshop presenter at the 2012 AGO convention in Nashville.

Rev. Mr. Thomas Winninger is an ordained deacon of the Catholic Church. He is Founder of the Winninger Institute and an internationally recognized speaker and author. His focus is helping individuals and organizations discover and live their created purpose of growing value and bringing meaning to everything they do. Winninger's ideals in life and business are to the point, understandable and simply implementable. Through the journeys in his personal and business life, Thom has come to rely on the belief that every person was born with fully unrealized potential intact. Deacon Winninger believes "Liturgical Worship is a convergence of scripture, music, homiletics, sacrament, and environment that engages the community in living faith in daily life."

A highly-respected faculty has been assembled to discuss topics such as Sustaining Ministry Growth, Leadership and Management, Music Repertoire and Technique, Engaging Homiletics, Prayer, Liturgical Art and Environment, Lay Ecclesial Ministry and Liturgical-Homiletic Convergence. Among the faculty are TCAGO members James Callahan, Jeffrey Patry, Kathy Borgen and Lynn Trapp. Additional faculty members include Matthew Culloton, director of The Singers-Minnesota Choral Artists, David Mennicke, chair of the Department of Music at Concordia University in St. Paul and Mark Lawson, President of MorningStar Music Publishers/ECS Publishing of St. Louis, MO.

This conference serves to bring together the key participants in pastoral liturgical ministry under one roof to share the spirit of worship and life as colleagues and co-workers in the vineyard of the Lord. The TCAGO 2011 – 2012 Annual Report

This has been a significant year for TCAGO because of the great number of organizational changes that have taken place. Philip Asgian and Martin Stachnik undertook the first audit of our financial records. Several recommendations emerged and the Board approved them. After a considerable search, the Investment Committee recommended to the Board that Michael Wright be designated our investment advisor for our Endowment Funds. The committee also developed an Investment Policy. The Board approved both.

Pipenotes changed its format: a full edition is posted on the TCAGO website and there is a smaller four-page printed edition for those who request a paper copy. The University of St. Thomas Service Center has become the printer for TCAGO publications. Barb Herzog ended her 22-year editorship of Pipenotes. Merritt Nequette is the new editor. In April Barb Herzog resigned as Registrar and John Salveson is the new Registrar. All TCAGO positions are now occupied by volunteers. There are now over fifty people; officers, board members, chairs of committees, committee members, and special coordinators, who volunteer their time for TCAGO.

The operating procedures passed – 103 yes, 1 no

Two new coordinating positions were created. Stephen Hamilton is the Membership Coordinator and Paul Lohman is the Advertising Coordinator. In addition to being Hospitality chair, Priscilla Franken is Secretary pro-tem. Maria Bucka, former Dean, chaired the Nominating Committee

After much research, it was decided to adopt WildApricot as an additional web server for the TCAGO website. It will add capacity to our communications systems including the possibility of registration and payment on line. TCAGO now has a Face-Book page.

Every committee completed a mission statement. A committee consisting of Sharon Kleckner, Jane Nienaber, David Geslin and James Callahan revised the TCAGO Operating Procedures. It had been almost ten years since any revision had been made to this document.

The Professional Development Committee revised the Salary Guidelines. The Composition Committee conducted a national competition for a choral piece with organ. The committee members judged 25 scores. *Psalm 130: Out of the Depths* by Craig Carnahan was declared the winner. The winners of the student competition were: First place winner: Alexis Van-

Zalen, Lawrence University, WI. Second place: Karl Robson, St. Olaf College. The Special Projects Committee received five requests for funding, three of which they recommended to the Board and were approved.

Revisions were made to the Membership Renewal Form, the Substitute organist list and the Organ Teacher list. Because so many members failed to renew their membership even a month after the deadline, Board members phoned everyone on the non-renewal list – three times. Eventually, working on a smaller list, a printed membership form along with a letter from the Dean was sent.

Income was generated by the sale of donated music and books. Additional income has been generated from the Email Blast system, advertising in *Pipenotes* and the annual Directory. Funds were raised for nine free TCAGO student memberships

A meeting with the Schubert Club took place to review our relationship and to explore an historical understanding regarding our cooperative efforts presenting the student competition.
