Neither will. The claim to have an exclusive right to that land—reaching from Lebanon in the north to Egypt in the south, and from the Mediterranean on the west to Jordan on the east—cannot be justified on the basis of good behavior, past or present. The present situation didn't begin on October 7, but had been simmering for decades. And, so far, armed force and political maneuvers have not effected peace.

Although I cannot speak knowledgeably for other religious traditions, I do know that the Christian message has a lot more to offer than "Do it my way or die!" Instead, I struggle to work with a system of forgiveness and reconciliation. Stable relations can be formed only when people respect their neighbors and treat them "as you would have them do unto you." Then there might be a real peace in the Middle East, and elsewhere.


My hope—after traveling there many times and living in Palestine for two years—is that the small Christian population will speak out with this message of reconciliation. May the Church be a catalyst for peace-making. May the song of Bethlehem's angels, "Glory to God, peace on earth!" be heard anew and human minds and hearts be changed. Easter is underway, with its annual hope of restoration and renewal. I pray that God will renew and restore the faithful in every land, and all our neighbors around the world. Make us instruments of your peace!

We set a new record for attendance with 36 students participating; counting parents, guardians, and TCAGO volunteers, we had 62 in total. Special thanks to our hosts at the University of St. Thomas,



and The Church of Saint Mark, both in Saint Paul, and also for the great work of several members of our Chapter's Publicity, Education, and Hospitality Committees. Through connections at The Church of Saint Mark, we were able to include a fair

number of Home School Network students from Minnesota and Wisconsin. We also tried something new this year by offering three options for



attendance: morning sessions, afternoon sessions, or full day with all sessions. If one adds up the morning and afternoon session counts, those attenders far exceed those that came for the full day.
