Dean's Column

It's full STEAM ahead for the TCAGO's Education Committee and its chair, Phil Asgian. In the October 2023 TAO, Sue Mitchell-Wallace announced the publication of a new comprehensive guidebook for Orgelkids/STEAM/Pipeworks programs. This resource is the fruit of a collaboration with



Phil, Sue, National AGO staff, Orgelkids USA, and with members of AGO chapters from around the country that are implementing OrgelKids education classes to various audiences.

If you are not familiar with Orgelkids, check out the Orgelkids USA website. Orgelkids in the Netherlands produces a small portable working pipe organ kit that can be assembled and reassembled multiple times for the purpose of engaging people in the pipe organ and how it works. Orgelkids USA is a non-profit organization that has collaborated with AGO chapters and other organizations to bring the kits to the US for chapters to use in their education and outreach. The expanding use of the Orgelkids kits has aligned with the growth of STEAM education. STEAM is an acronym that stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math, a concept that describes the general direction for education in the US right now.

Our chapter does not have an Orgelkids kit, but it has the mighty "Mini Opus." We are coming up on the

20th anniversary of its introduction as the distinctive tool of our chapter's educational programs. You will be hearing more soon about events this coming spring to mark that anniversary and to celebrate the impact of the instrument on our chapter's outreach.

I do not know the origins of our annual Pipe Organ Discovery Days event, but Phil reports that when he joined the Education committee in 1988 the program was already going strong. A few years later when he became committee chair, the Pipe Organ Discovery Day was gradually expanded and enhanced by adding sessions by Minnesota organ builder Charles Hendrickson and by Michael Barone. Then Phil turned his sights to incorporating resources provided by the AGO's national PipeWorks program, piloted by Ruth Caswell in Seattle in 1997. The next stage of these early efforts was the establishment of the chapter's own PipeWorks program, a joint venture with Westminster Presbyterian Church. The work on the PipeWorks Twin Cities program led to the collaboration with Melanie Ohnstad, Lynn Dobson, Paul Lohman, and others that produced Mini Opus, delivered in 2004. Since then, the PipeWorks program has been well equipped to provide education to schools, churches, summer music camps, and more. Most recently the committee presented PipeWorks programs to the Cannon Valley Elder Collegium, St. John's Lutheran Church Summer music camp in Howard Lake, St. Anthony Park Lutheran Church in Saint Paul, and the Pipe Organ Discovery Day at Northrop Auditorium in February 2023.

Phil and his committee were doing "STEAM" long before STEAM education was a thing. The PipeWorks program is interdisciplinary, interconnected, collaborative, creative, observation based, hands on, and fun for students and educators alike. After many years of innovative and impactful teaching, Phil and our committee have now become consultants and resources to the regional and national AGO. Phil recently met with colleagues from the Duluth Arrowhead Chapter to discuss education projects to make use of their recently acquired Orgelkids kit. And of course, Phil and his committee presented their work and ideas at a wonderful workshop at last summer's regional convention.

I've had a sneak preview of the Orgelkids resource, which will be available for download soon. Action photos from our own PipeWorks programs are prominently featured. Congratulations to Phil and the Education Committee.

A Word from Our Chaplain

This summer I had time to update my personal memoirs, looking back over the nine years since I moved from central Illinois to Minnesota. Much of my attention and delight while living here has been working with local musicians. Ever since I accepted the invitation to serve as chaplain to this

chapter of the AGO in 2017, I have gained friends and colleagues among the members. I especially appreciate the three deans under whom I have served: Paul Westermeyer, Jacob Benda, and David Jenkins.

As I came to know Paul better, I offered the suggestion that he and I team-teach a short course on the church cantatas of Bach. He approved. We considered venues for such a class, finally deciding on Resurrection Church, Roseville, where Paul is an active member. Once a week for six weeks in 2018 we sat down with 20 to 30 others to analyze, discuss, and listen to cantatas. The response of this group was surprisingly enthusiastic. So much so, that we planned a second "Bach Seminar" for 2019, this time concentrating on the *St. John Passion*. In 2020 our Seminar focused on Bach's instrumental music. This series was held at Como Park Lutheran Church.

Plans for our next Seminar were postponed due to COVID-19, but in 2022 we worked our way through the six parts of the *Christmas Oratorio*, and in 2023 it was the *St. Matthew Passion*. Each year the interest seems to deepen and grow, and as teachers and discussion leaders both Paul and I have gained understanding, inspiration, and pleasure. Plans for one more Seminar are on the table: a study of the Mass in B Minor and *The Art of Fugue*. We want to begin on **January 9**, continuing through five more Tuesday evenings. I hope you can join the challenges of Bach's final masterpieces.






