TCAGO Board, Committees, etc. 7 highlights of a recent road trip to New Ulm. The town is a great destination for an overnight visit to explore the breweries, do some shopping, climb the Hermann the German monument, visit the famous Glockenspiel bell tower, and enjoy some authentic German cuisine.

At one time New Ulm billed itself the "Polka Capital of the Nation." The museum appears to have been established especially to celebrate the very lively musical history

and culture of this Germansettled area. Wildly successful musicians like New Ulm native John Wilfahrt are featured, along with musicians, bands, and festivals



embodying the heritage of "Old-Time" music in the state. However, the museum also offers a wider view of the Minnesota music scene, through a charming small-town lens. When you walk in the door, you are greeted by a lifesized statue of Prince on the left and friendly docent on the right, who gives you a hand-held audio device that allows you to select informative commentary and sound files for each inductee.

However, unlike the orderly and carefully curated Schubert Club Museum, the MMHF is crammed full of memorabilia and photos of past and present Minnesota and Minnesota-connected musicians and ensembles in all categories, juxtaposed in the most fascinatingly random manner. A fancy dress once belonging to Lorie Line is displayed near early John Denver concert posters, not three feet away from a bass guitar made from a toilet seat. A whole shelf dedicated to recent inductee Rev. Michael Joncas rests just below a shelf dedicated to the Del Counts, a long-running regional rock and roll band. Photos of Dean Billmeyer and Michael Barone appear on the same wall of shelves as a display of Judy Garland memorabilia.

related to classical music are enshrined in the museum. F. Melius Christiansen was inducted in 1989, the opening year of the Hall of Fame. Organist and organ-related inductees include Philip Brunelle, Michael Barone, Paul Manz, and Dean Billmeyer. Dominick Argento and Libby Larson represent noteworthy Minnesota composers. Classical ensemble inductees include the Minnesota Orchestra, the Saint Paul Chamber Orchestra, Minnesota Opera, the Dale Warland Singers, the Minnesota Chorale, and the St. Olaf Choir.

Michael Barone was selected for induction to the MMHF in 2002, on the 20th anniversary of the beginning of *Pipedreams*. His **brief bio** on the MMHF website mentions *Pipedreams* only at the end of the last paragraph. Now *Pipedreams* has reached its 40th year, and still counting! You don't have to make a pilgrimage to New Ulm to celebrate our "Hall of Famer." I hope you will all attend the anniversary celebration concert hosted by MPR and YourClassical *Pipedreams* on September 17 at Bethel University. Michael certainly deserves our admiration and gratitude for all of his outstanding achievements, and for his unswerving support for the organ and organists, for the AGO, and for our chapter.

A Word from Our Chaplain

REV. JOHN SETTERLUND

A message given on July 6 at Morning Prayer during the Regional Convention:

"Whoever welcomes you welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me," Jesus says to the disciples (Matthew 10:40).

In calling together his friends as "disciples" and preparing them to go out as missionaries or "apostles," Jesus makes it clear that the days ahead may not be easy. They are, in fact, encouraged to "take up their cross," whatever that might be, and follow his example—even if that leads to disappointment, conflict, fear, or grief.



But Jesus also promises that, if anyone receives them *as his messengers*, they have received him and have his blessings. Plus, they receive God Almighty, from whom Jesus is coming. This is good news! That's hope, redemption, eternal life for anyone who pays attention to these messengers.

However, it doesn't go down easy for everyone. Even John the Baptist isn't so sure that Jesus is the best solution for the world's problems (and for his own—he is now in prison). And people would undoubtedly continue to squabble like children, about singing and dancing to happy



tunes or weeping to sad ones. And more complex and serious issues lay on the horizon—political dissension, religious opposition, and an apocalyptic future.

Maybe this is why Jesus' "mission" at first avoids the Gentiles and the Samaritan towns, but seeks out only the "lost sheep of Israel." There are plenty of problems 'right

here in River City.' By the end of the gospel, however, the apostles are commissioned to make disciples of "all nations." The wonders of God's reign reach far beyond the borders of any one nation or culture.

The mission of Christ, and Christians, is to bring a new life to the whole world, where there is way too much violence, hostility, and fear. Our part, as musicians, I am confident, shares a message of kindness, forgiveness, justice, and peace-making.

As we have come together this week to celebrate our music ministry and hone our skills, I suppose most of us *don't* fear physical abuse back home on account of our work, or social humiliation because of our love for beauty and its responsibilities that we carry. But not everyone shares our enthusiasm or appreciates the same values. The pay isn't great, even if there are many other rewards.

Whatever faced him, Jesus remained confident in God's wisdom and power, and has bestowed every blessing on those who tell us (and play and sing) of God's glory. To us he says again: "Come to me, all you who are weary and carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest."




